### Town Officials Outline Current Activity and Projects

On September 12<sup>th</sup>, the Board of Selectmen and a number of town officials and department heads hosted a community forum to report on current activities within the community and to hear concerns from local residents.

Meeting in the newly renovated cafeteria of the Auburn Village School, Selectman Todd Bedard facilitated the program which featured the Police Chief, Fire Chief, Building Inspector, Parks & Recreation Coordinator, Library Director, Tax Collector and School Board Chair.

The participants outlined the activities and projects of their respective areas for the current year, and fielded questions from the public who was present. A tour of the new addition to the Auburn Village School completed the evening activity.

### FY 2020 Budget Process Underway

The Board of Selectmen has begun work on the Town's FY 2020 operating budget and warrant articles. In early September, the Board received a composite budget package that included all of the initial budget requests from all Town boards, departments and officials.

At this early juncture, the budget requests total \$5,895,611, which is an increase of \$173,249 (3.03%) over the approved 2019 budget of \$5,722,362. In early October, the Budget

Throughout the months of Selectmen will be meeting individually with all of the departments to go through the details of their budget proposals before making determinations for their budget recommendations.

Committee will begin meeting to receive the same package of initial September and October, the Board of requests, in addition to the Board of Selectmen's recommendations on those requests. The Budget Committee will continue meeting into early January 2020 before completing their work and presenting the budget to the voters for their consideration.

### Parks & Recreation Chair Resigns

The Board of Selectmen regretfully accepted the resignation of Parks & Recreation Commission Chair Lisa Canavan last month. An 11- year member of the Commission, Lisa indicated her family was re-locating

and she would not be able to continue her service on the Commission. Since 2008, she has served as either an alternate member or a full member of the Commission,

with the past two years serving as the Commission Chair.

### Conservation Commission Seeks Alternate Members

The Conservation Commission recently lost its only alternate member due to the individual moving from Auburn. The Commission would welcome an Auburn resident or two who might

be interested in serving as an alternate member of the Commission.

The Commission normally meetings monthly on the first Tuesday of the

month at the Town Hall. Anyone who is interested in serving should contact either Conservation Commission Chair Jeffrey Porter or Land Use Administrator Denise Royce at the Town Hall.



### Renovation of Police Department Space Underway

Work has continued during the past month on a small addition on the back side of the police department portion of the Safety Complex on Eaton Hill Road.


The foundation and concrete slab for the addition has been placed, in addition to relocating one of the existing exterior air conditioning system condensers. Framing work began in the middle of the month,

with the roof trusses being delivered during the last week of September.

This project will result in addressing the three main deficiencies for the department that involve space for separate locker rooms for male and female officers, a records storage area and storage space for larger items currently stored in storage trailers.

### **Babysitting Class**



- 3. Vehicles will be provided an authorized trunk number upon check-in.
- 4. All vehicle engines must be off during the event.
- 5. Vehicles must remain at the event until the event ends at 8:00 PM. For safety purposes, vehicles will not be allowed to leave the parking lot until the event is over.
- 6. All vehicles must be stocked with sufficient number of treats to distribute at the sole expense of the applicant. All candy should be individually wrapped treats of first quality and safe for children to consume
- 7. No alcoholic beverages or tobacco products will be allowed at this event.

If you would like to come to the event just to trick or treat without a decorated vehicle, you do not need to preregister. All are welcome!

# **BOSTON POST CANE**

The most recent recipient of the Boston Post Cane, Mr. George Frederick Dodd, passed away on August 20, 2019, just a couple months shy of his 100<sup>th</sup> birthday.

The Boston Post Cane has a long history dating back to 1909 when the founder and publisher of the Boston Post newspaper gave canes to officials of towns and cities in Massachusetts, New Hampshire and Rhode Island as a promotional tool. Since 1909 there have been 32 holders of the cane in Auburn. Asa Row was the town's first recipient.

# **School Construction News**



The 2019-2020 school year is off to a great start and the teachers and students are settling into a very different building. Without a doubt, the biggest part of the AVS Construction and Renovation was building the new classroom wing and making sure it was ready by the start of this school year. In late August, we got the green light to move in and many of you in town may have heard a collective PHEW from everyone involved in the project. A great outcome after a very busy summer.

The start of school went very well. Bus drop-off and pick-up and parent drop-off and pick-up went off without a hitch. And the teachers in the new classroom wing met their students in the cafeteria on the first day so they could guide them to their new classrooms. The AVS team put a lot of thought into how to safely and smoothly launch the school year and it paid off.

At this point in the project, there are primarily four areas of work that will continue over the next several months.

- Five-classroom elementary wing These are the classrooms to the left when you're looking at the front of the building. We are on track to open this wing up at the end of the year.
- Main entrance and front office Our administration and office staff are currently located near the temporary main entrance while their old space is being renovated. They will be able to move into their new space in November.
- Rear entrance restrooms These are the restrooms next to the cafeteria and gym. They are slated to be completed in October.
- Athletic Fields and Grounds A lot of work is underway to grade the soccer/lacrosse field and the softball field. The fields will be irrigated and seeding will have happened by the time you read this.

Last month, the Elementary and Middle School Open Houses were held and many students were proud to show off their mostly new school to their parents. Many Auburn residents also attended a meeting convened by the Selectmen and were able to get a tour of the school. Many folks said the school is bright, airy, clean and cheerful – a great environment for learning!

Have a great October and look for continued updates over the next few months.











# School Yard News

The school year is off to a great start! We are settling into our beautiful new building and students are enjoying the added space, especially our beautiful new cafeteria. The added size and noise barriers have made lunchtime a more enjoyable time for everyone and best of all, we can begin our lunches at 11:30 rather than 10:30 as in previous years. The two doors in the cafeteria have reduced bottlenecks by permitting separate entrance



and exit routes. The serving area is larger and wider reducing the wait times for students who opt for a cold lunch or just a beverage. The new tables convert to benches which allow the space to be used for training or lectures.

Our playground area will be enhanced by a Ga-ga Pit financed by our NJHS, Student Council, and Yearbook Clubs. The pit will be erected by volunteers from those organizations as well as some parents. What is Ga-ga? Ga-ga is a fast paced, high energy sport played in an octagonal pit. The more players the better! Dubbed a kinder gentler version of dodgeball, the game is played with a soft foam ball, and combines the skills of dodging, striking, running, and jumping, while trying to hit opponents with a ball below the knees.

Lastly, at 6:30 pm on September 26th AVS will host a special presentation with Peg Dawson, Ed.D., NCS. Along with her colleague, Dr. Richard Guare, she has written several books for parents and professionals on the topic of executive functioning skills, including *Smart but Scattered* and *Smart but Scattered Teens*. Executive functions involve planning for the future and strategic thinking, the ability to inhibit or delay responding, self-regulation, initiating a behavior, and shifting between activities flexibly. When kids have issues with executive functioning, any task that requires planning, organization, memory, time management and flexible thinking becomes a challenge. Peg uses the latest neuroscience research to show you and your child how to get their brain to alert differently so they

can have good executive functioning.
