#### **Town Hall Lift Replacement**

As we write this, the replacement of the Auburn Town Hall lift is just about complete. Our previous lift was installed in 1994 and was in need of an update. With funds from the Buildings Restoration Capital Reserve Fund, we were able to purchase this new lift which will provide the same access points as our previous model and will hopefully be here for many years to come.

#### E-Waste & Hazardous Waste Days are Here!!

Please mark your calendars for the annual Hazardous & E-Waste Collection events. The annual "E-Waste Collection" event will be held on Saturday, September 24th from 9 am to 2 pm in the front parking lot of the Auburn Safety Complex on Eaton Hill Road. Without a charge, Auburn residents may dispose of "anything with a plug" including, but not limited to: Laptops, Monitors, Printers, Fax machines, Scanners, Keyboards & Mice, Main Frames, Wire, Telecomm Equip., Stereos & Radio Equip., Speakers, VCR/DVD Players, TVs, Microwaves, A/C, Humidifiers, Dehumidifiers, Space Heaters, Propane Tanks, Computers, Servers, Circuit Boards, Copiers, Cable Attachments, Cell Phones, Cameras, E-book Readers, MP3 Players, Modems, UPS/Battery Backup, White Goods.

The annual **Household Hazardous Waste** Collection Day event will again be held in the Town of Raymond at the end of Industrial Drive, across the street from the Raymond Safety Complex. This event is held jointly for residents of Auburn, Nottingham and Raymond on September 24th from 8am-12pm. See page 3 for more information on what items are and are not accepted.

#### **Auburn Receives Second Half of Federal Funds**

The Town of Auburn has received the second half of its funds from the federal American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) that is intended to assist the Town and its taxpayers over the next several years.

As previously stated, the town received \$292,188.80 in August of 2021 and just received our second half of \$292,188.82. To date, the town has used these funds on many projects including safety updates to all town buildings, new radios for our Fire Department, a turnout gear extractor and dryer for the Fire Department, replacement of toilet and lavatory units for the holding cell area at the Police Department, completion of the storage building for Parks & Recreation and Police Department, replacement of analog telephone systems at the Fire, Police and Town Hall, repairs to the Eddows Field Clubhouse, ceiling insulation in the area of the Police Department, and an air compressor and tool attachment at the Highway Department.

We currently have a few projects anticipated to be covered with these ARPA funds in the near future, such as updates to the Auburn Village and Longmeadow Cemeteries and four AED Units to be purchased and placed in all town buildings.

#### **Pingree Hill Fire Station Siding**

The Pingree Hill fire station will be receiving a face lift this year. The project has been awarded to JMR Siding and work should begin by the end of this year.
