At the first Board meeting following the March elections, the Board of Selectmen re-elected Jim Headd to serve as Selectmen Chairman, while Rick Eaton was re-elected as Vice Chairman.

The Board also delegated its exofficio committee assignments by including Jim Headd as the Selectmen's representative to the Budget Committee and to the Parks & Recreation Commission. Rick Eaton will continue to serve as the Selectmen's representative to the Highway Safety Committee, while Keith Leclair will serve as the Selectmen's representative to the Planning Board.

a number of Auburn
residents have been
appointed by the

Board of Selectmen to positions on various town boards and committees.

Reappointed to the Highway Safety Committee for one year terms were Dan Carpenter, Mike DiPietro and Eva Komaridis, while Sharon Bluhm and Jean Worster were re-appointed to one-year terms as Library Trustee Alternates.

Diana Heaton was re-appointed to three year terms on the Conservation Commission.

In the coming months, positions on the Parks & Recreation Commission and Zoning Board of Adjustment will be filled, in addition to potentially reauthorizing the Auburn Development Authority.

Destination Imagination



The DI program is preparing the next generation of innovators and leaders with STEAM-based creativity, critical thinking, collaboration, and communication skills.

On Saturday, March 17th, 4 teams from the Auburn Village School traveled to Goffstown High School to present their solutions for their selected challenges at our Regional Meet. New Hampshire DI sponsors 4 regional meets throughout the state.

Our Rising Stars, the non competitive teams of the DI program, wowed the audience with their solutions to the *Friends Everywhere* challenge. These teams needed to research two different cultures to compare and contrast how children live, learn and play.

The elementary team chose to solve the *Drop Zone* challenge. This team had to design and build a freestanding structure from 100% natural wood whose total weight must not exceed 175 grams. The structure's height must be at least 7.5in and no more than 9.0in. In addition, the team had to create and present a story about a sudden event that has dramatic impact that integrated the structure testing into their 8 minute story. This team's structure held 135 pounds! Our Middle School team solved the *Unlikely Attraction* challenge. This team needed to design and build an attraction that functions in an Unlikely Location that may be any place, real or imaginary, where amusement park attractions are not usually found. The attraction must operate live during the 8-minute Presentation. For this Challenge, the attraction needed to be any team-created device that operates using at least 3 Scientific Concepts. Our Middle School team earned a Da Vinci which is the highest DI award given for having a unique approach to a solution, for risk taking, and/or for outstanding creativity. Their appraiser team wrote:

This team was a "no-brainer" for this award: they combined multiple pieces of excellence into a "seamless," cohesive whole. With art, music, sewing, and engineering, they lit up all our cortexes!
