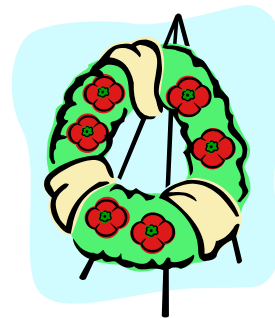

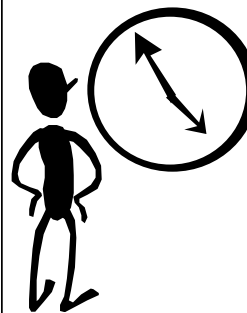

News from the Auburn Town Hall

2011 Tax Rate

The Town of Auburn was in line in October to be among the first communities in New Hampshire to have their tax rate set for 2011. An overall increase in the Town's net assessed valuation of property combined with budgeting efforts at the Town, County and School District level this past year resulted in the reduced tax rate for 2011.

The 2011 tax rate of \$18.94 is a 45-cent (2.33%) reduction from the 2010 tax rate of \$19.39. The following is a breakdown of the tax rate:

With the tax rate in hand, second issue property tax bills will be out in the mail in early November with a due date of Monday, December 12.

Boards and Commissions

Kathi Porter, a long-time member of the Zoning Board of Adjustment (ZBA), has resigned her position due to personal considerations. The Board accepted her resignation with deep regret due to Kathi's long and dedicated service to the Town in this position.

Elizabeth Robidoux has been appointed to fill the remaining term of Mrs. Porter's position on the ZBA.

Lisa Canavan has been appointed to fill the position on the Parks and Recreation Commission that resulted from the resignation of Norm Bouley. Ms. Canavan has been an alternate member of the Commission for a number of years.

Timothy Therrien has been appointed to serve as an alternate member of the Parks & Recreation Commission, filling the position that Ms. Canavan had previously held.

The Town has several vacancies for alternate members of the Zoning Board of Adjustment. Anyone interested in serving on the ZBA is encouraged to contact any member of the ZBA, Land Use Secretary Denise Royce, the Town Administrator or any one of the Selectmen to express their interest.

Personnel Policy Update

Within the past two months, two major efforts have been completed by the Board of Selectmen, Library Trustees and Police Commissioners concerning Town government operations and the handling of personnel. A current wage and classification system for all positions was completed last month with the assistance of the NH Local Government Center, while work to update the Town's Personnel Policy has also been completed.

The wage and classification systems effort included a full review and updating of detailed job descriptions for all positions within the Town system, both full and part-time. The job descriptions ensure the Town is in full compliance with various state and federal labor laws and regulations.

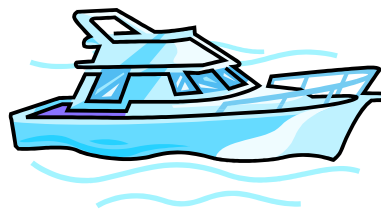

With the job descriptions complete, a job classification system was then prepared, in addition to a wage scale that encompassed all of the positions. The classification system and wage scale are included as sections in the Town's Personnel Policy.

The Town's Personnel Policy details the responsibility and benefits of working for the Town of Auburn. The policy affects all Town employees, regardless of what department they are in or position they hold.

Boat Agent

During the past month, Town Clerk Joanne Linxweiler has taken steps to have the Town Clerk and Deputy Town Clerk licensed as Boat Agents with the NH Department of Safety. This will enable them to also register boats for Auburn residents, in addition to motor vehicles.



Be watching for a future announcement once the process is complete and the Town Clerk's Office is set-up as a State of New Hampshire Boat Agent.

Sucker Brook 'Cross Donates \$7,000.00 to Auburn Resident



An Auburn resident fighting cancer was the biggest winner of the 7th annual Sucker Brook 'Cross, a cyclocross race held at Auburn Village School. Race Director Jack Chapman, with his wife Barbara, recently presented Karen Jenness with a check in the amount of \$7,000- to help with medical expenses.

"The donation is thanks to our generous sponsors and participants",. Chapman said this week. "Everyone who raced, sponsored or volunteered should be proud of their contribution. The support of local individuals as well as local and regional businesses and organizations has been simply awesome!"

This is Karen's third brush with cancer in the past thirteen years and her current chemotherapy will run into February of 2012. The mother of two and engaged to be married, Karen was overwhelmed with the amount of support and wishes to thank everyone involved with the event!

The Sucker Brook 'Cross, held Sept. 25th, has become a "must do" event on the New England calendar and is one of the fastest growing cyclocross races in New England. In its seventh year, the event registered 448 racers from throughout New England and has established a tradition of raising money to benefit local residents with cancer or other life threatening diseases. Chapman noted that since 2005 the event has raised a total of \$38,000 to aid Auburn cancer patients and he singled out the *Auburn Volunteer Fire Department* for their continued and invaluable support of the event.

"As cyclocross becomes more popular in New England, and as our race continues to grow, we look forward to continuing to help local residents who are in need," Chapman said.

Group A Neighborhood Watch

On October 12th Group A had their first informational meeting to organize their neighborhood watch program. Ken Geddes delivered a very well thought out power point presentation. Officer Beaulieu stopped by to introduce himself and answered questions from the group of 20 residents. Stickers and handbooks were given out to help residents be alert and take measures to protect their property.



Maps were provided to help residents understand the territory of Group A. A decision was made for postings of signs for the Group A area. The list of signs is now being given to the Police Department so they can approve and work with the road agent for installation of the signs. Group A is in the area of Exit 2 off Route 101 which extends down Hooksett Road to the center of town and out to the Candia and Hooksett town lines.

Group A is beginning the process of setting up the organization and to determine communication methods for residents. We currently have 26 families that want to be included in the Watch program for Group A and hope to have more families join.

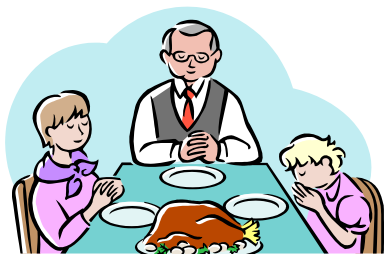

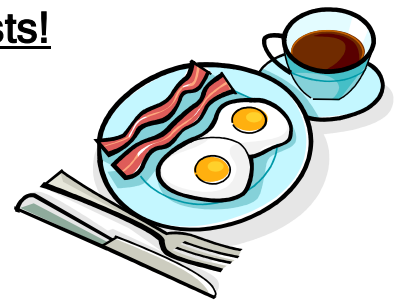

The Massabesic Audubon Center, operated by the Audubon Society of New Hampshire and supported by local volunteers, is conveniently located at 26 Audubon Way, here in Auburn. 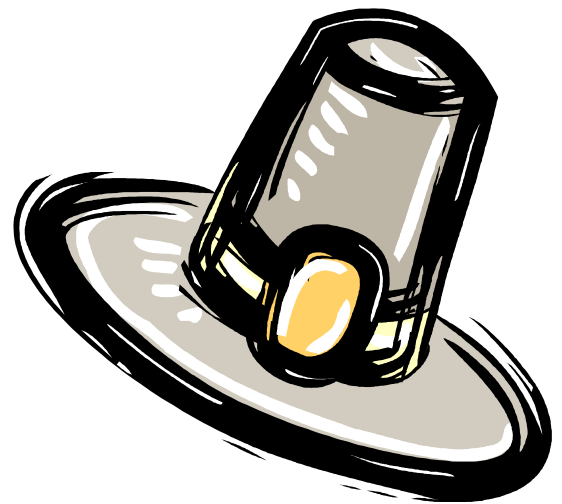

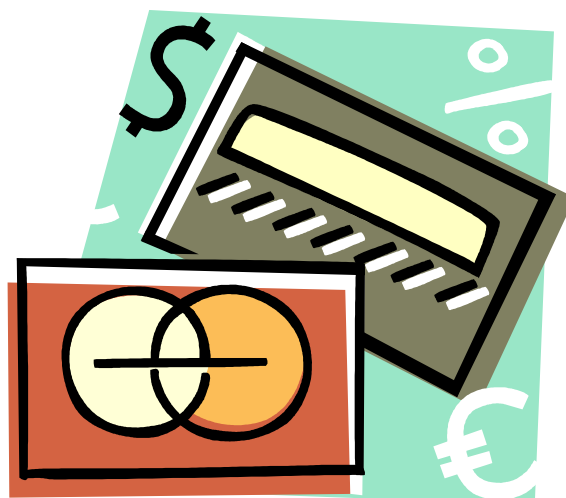


From the Town Clerk's Office...

Credit Cards

We are now accepting **credit cards** for payment of motor vehicle registrations and dog licenses. There is a 2.95% fee (\$1.50 minimum) charged per transaction - this is a processing fee and is not retained by the Town of Auburn.

We are not able to accept VISA at the counter; however, if you renew using the E-Reg online program then VISA is accepted. This is a VISA rule which we must follow.



Also, for those wishing to pay by check - we are now a **“one-check”** town—when paying you will only need to write one combined check payable to the Town of Auburn to complete your registration.
