



## News from the Auburn Town Hall



### **Margate Drive and Lantern Lane**

The Board of Selectmen has determined the major road reconstruction projects for this year will be done on Margate Drive and Lantern Lane.

A full reconstruction effort will take place on the entirety of Margate Drive. In addition to rebuilding the 1,658-foot long road, with paved portion of the road will be reduced to a 24-foot wide paved surface instead of the current 30-feet. As part of this effort, the Town will re-connect all existing driveways to the improved road, in addition to cleaning up the road sides and drainage swales within the Town's right-of-way. It is anticipated work could commence by late May or early June. The reconstruction project is expected to cost \$301,337.

For Lantern Lane, a reclaim and paving effort is being planned instead of full reconstruction. The current paved surface of the 1,005-foot long road will be torn up and put back in place before the entire road is repaved. This project is anticipated to cost approximately \$158,220.

### **Congratulations Megan Cooley - Miss New Hampshire**

Auburn's own Megan Cooley became the 68<sup>th</sup> woman to bear the Miss New Hampshire title when she was crowned during the Miss New Hampshire Scholarship Pageant held at Pinkerton Academy on May 3<sup>rd</sup>.

Megan's song choice of "*On My Way*" during the talent portion of the pageant competition certainly proved prophetic in terms of the scholarship pageant.

A junior at University of New Hampshire, Megan is working on two majors in neuroscience and psychology. She has a career ambition of becoming a pediatric oncologist at Boston Children's Hospital. As the winner of the Miss New Hampshire Scholarship Pageant, she received a \$14,000 scholarship.

In the fall, Megan will represent the Granite State in the annual Miss American Scholarship Pageant, one of the largest scholarship programs for young women in the country.

All of Auburn is extremely proud of the tremendous effort Megan put into this program, and she will carry the support and best wishes of all her Auburn neighbors. We will all be collectively cheering for Megan!

### **Additional Citizen Appointments**

Dross was re-appointed as Deputy Treasurer following her nomination by Town Treasurer Christine Soucie.

The Town has also partnered with the Auburn Historical Association and other town organizations to sponsor an enhanced Duck Race activity to be held in September. Appointed to serve as the coordinating Duck Race Committee are Dee Cleary, Dan Carpenter, Pat Clement, Patrick Glennon, Alan Villeneuve and Kevin Heald.

### **Griffin Mill Bridge**

The Town has received formal notice from the NH Department of Transportation (NHDOT) the Griffin Mill Bridge has been enrolled in the State Bridge Aid Program and will be eligible for 80% state funding for construction costs.

The notice officially indicates the bridge will initially be listed for repair in 2022, but with increased funding coming to the program after July 1<sup>st</sup>, they anticipate moving the project to State Fiscal Year 2018, which will allow the Town to begin the construction work after July 1, 2017.

Including engineering costs, the estimated cost of the bridge project is a total of \$380,000, of which \$304,000 will be funded through the State Bridge Aid Program.







I was impressed and I'm grateful. Now - I'M BACK!

First, the members of the Auburn Police Department want to congratulate Megan Cooley of Auburn. She is the newest Miss New Hampshire, which is an amazing accomplishment, and a great honor to the Town of Auburn. The Officers wanted to extend their well wished because Megan was a member of the law enforcement community because of being a D.A.R.E. student at Auburn Village School. D.A.R.E. Officer Chris Beaulé remembers her, and said she was a stand out student. Also, Megan played softball on Lieutenant Ray Pelton's team. January is usually high because of the Christmas gift packaging that is left out to be collected by the trash collector. The bad guys target homes with the TV boxes outside, and other electronic toys. For the people that were burglarized in January, it's no comfort to learn that January is a typical month for burglaries. From a Police point of view, we are grateful there were only four. Manchester is next door and they had about fifty that month.

Detective Sergeant Chip Chabot has had great success in working the cases and has solved some of them. He stays on top of all the investigations, and frequently gets tips from the Auburn Neighborhood Watch group (NW). The NW continues to be an extremely effective tool for the Auburn Police Department for preventing burglaries, and assisting in other investigations. We remain thankful.




It's just about that time again - Griffin Free has summer reading programs for all ages coming up soon!







## Auburn Fire Department Presents:

### Outside Burning Rules and Guidelines for Brush Fire Safety:

As you are aware, this is the time of year when brush fire incidents increase dramatically due to warmer and drier conditions. Most brush fires can easily be prevented simply by being aware and responsible. Careless disposal of smoking materials is one of the leading causes of brush fires. Sparks from recreational vehicles and outdoor power equipment also contribute to many fires. In 2013, 182 wild-land fires were reported in New Hampshire with approximately 144 acres burned, and 22 structures compromised. The largest fire consumed 51 acres.

Permits are required by law. The town of Auburn extends the requirements defined by state law for outdoor burning to its residents. The fire must be on your own property and you must be the property owner. A tenant or child of the owner cannot obtain a fire permit (you must be 18 years of age). Fires should be established in an open area, without tree limbs or power lines overhead. At best, a garden hose can reach a height of about 20 feet, so anything above that is out of your control. Remember, it's your liability if you burn something down even with a proper fire permit. Your fire should also be on solid ground containing no roots. Fire can ignite an underground tree root which may burn underground and pop up to the surface several days, and many feet away - Usually when nobody is there to see. The result is an uncontrolled fire that may go unreported until several acres are burned. You must be prepared to put out your fire immediately if asked to do so. This generally means a garden hose that reaches around the fire area, and that your fire is small enough to be extinguished *with* a garden hose. You must observe the fire at all times. Otherwise, douse it with water and stir until there are no glowing embers left. Burn only untreated wood, paper and natural yard waste. Trash burning is prohibited. Burn nothing over five inches in diameter. Thick logs and tree trunks must be split into pieces less than five 5 inches in diameter.

#### Fire Categories:

Category I: Category I fires are fires that are contained with a ring of fire-resistant material not exceeding two feet in diameter. The fire must be 25 feet from any building, fence or other structure. Included are fires in many "Chimneas" and similar portable devices.

Category II: Category II fires are fires that are contained within a ring of fire resistant material not exceed four feet in diameter. The fire must be at least 50 feet from any building, fence or other structure.

Category III: Category III fires are fires greater than 4 feet in diameter, OR are not contained within a ring of fire resistant material. The fire must be at least 50 feet from any building, fence or other structure.

A Seasonal fire permit may be issued for both category I and II fires if you burn on a frequent basis. An Auburn Firer Warden will inspect your fire site and register you as a seasonal permit holder. The advantage of seasonal permit is that the Fire Warden will not subject you to the litany of rules and regulations each time you wish to burn. However, you are still required to call in to the fire department each time you plan to burn.

You may burn during the day (between 9:00 AM and 5:00 PM) if it is raining or if there is at least one inch of snow on the ground. Keep in mind that frozen garden hoses do not meet burning guidelines. In the case of snow coverage, a shovel may suffice based upon the size of the fire. If the rain stops, your permit will be voided.

#### Classes of Fire Days.

Class 1 Day = Low Fire Danger.

Class 2 Day = Moderate Fire Danger.

Class 3 Day = High Fire Danger. Permits will be issued at the discretion of the local Fire Warden.

Class 4 Day = Very High Fire Danger. No permits will be issued.

Class 5 Day = Extremely High Fire Danger. No permits will be issued.

In order to receive a burn permit you must call the Deputy Warden at 603-247-7511 or apply online at [www.auburnfire.org](http://www.auburnfire.org), under "burning permit information". **Permits will only be issued between the hours of 10am to 5pm.** If you are applying on line, please be specific leaving your name, address, phone number, email address, and type of permit requested. If there is no answer on the warden phone, be sure to leave your name, phone number, address and the type of permit requested.

## 2014 MOSQUITO COLLECTION AND TESTING DATES

Swamp Inc. will start adult mosquito collections in the month of June of 2014. Mosquito populations will be recorded and only collections in June of *Cs. melanura* (primary vector for EEE) will be sent to the Connecticut Agricultural Experimental Station for EEE/WNV testing. We usually receive these results by the end of the 2014 season.



Unless otherwise stated, mosquito testing performed will be separated into two phases for mosquito submissions; phase I (early season) and phase II (mid to end season).

Phase I - July 1 through July 31, 2014 (dates pertain to date of collection):

*Cs. morsitans, Cs. melanura, Cx. pipiens, Cx. restuans, Cx. pipiens/restuans, Oc. canadensis and Ae. vexans.* Only these species will be tested. Any batch (group of mosquitoes) size may be submitted, but cannot exceed 50 mosquitoes.


Phase II - August 1 or first EEE or WNV detection (whichever comes first) through September 30, 2014:

In addition to the above species, *Ae. cinerus, An. punctipennis, An. walkeri,* (The Maine Lab will not be accepting the listed *An.* species: only NH Lab), *Cq. perturbans, Oc. japonicus, Oc. triseriatus, Ps. ferox, Cx. salinarius, and Oc. sollicitans* will be tested if batch size > 10 mosquitoes (but cannot exceed 50 mosquitoes).
