Boston Post Cane

Whereas, in 1909, the Boston Post provided the Town of Auburn with a fine cane manufactured especially for this purpose by J.F. Fradley & Co., of New York. The stick is a carefully selected ebony from the Congo, Africa, and the head is made of rolled gold of 14 karat fineness.

Whereas, the head of the cane is artistically engraved as presented by The Boston Post to the Oldest Citizen of Auburn (to be transmitted).

Whereas, the Board of Selectmen act as trustee of the cane and has seen that the stick is duly presented and duly transmitted when such a change of holders becomes necessary.

Whereas, there have been 31 Auburn residents – 14 men and 16 women – who have been the holders of the Boston Post Cane between 1909 and 2016.


Whereas, it has been determined that you are the “Oldest Citizen of Auburn”.


The Board of Selectmen does hereby present to you, the Boston Post Cane on this, the 2nd day of November, 2016.
