



For Selectman, Three Years

Name: RUSSELL SULLIVAN

Address: 207 Spofford Rd

Office for which you are running: Selectman

Why you see yourself as a qualified candidate:

I have dedicated time to making Auburn a Town in which we want to live. I started on the planning board in 1981 and in 1987 became chairman. I wrote the original Wetlands Protection Regulations, and also wrote the Sludge Disposal Regulations, both of which were the first in the State of NH. These regulations were designed to force developers to leave buffers around wetlands, brooks, streams and bodies of water thereby reducing the possibility of pollution to those areas and prevent sludge disposal in Auburn.

In 2006, I was elected Selectman to serve you at the highest level of the town. My goal has been to represent you and keep Auburn the Town you enjoy. I have continued my efforts of protecting the rural nature of Auburn by entering into an agreement with the Manchester Water Works to own the land surrounding the Audubon Center. Additionally, I worked to secure a long term agreement with the Water Works to help them keep their 4,000 acres natural and undeveloped. I worked with a local land owner to secure the rights to his sand and gravel at a significant savings to the tax payers.

Any changes or improvements you would like to see within the realm of this office:

I will continue my focus on environmental issues but add planning for our aging population. I think there is much a town can do to provide services and residences for those of us passing the half century mark. As your Selectman I will continue to support the needs of the Auburn Volunteer Fire Fighters and the Auburn Police Officers so they can best provide for your safety. For Highway Agent, Three Years

Name: FRANCIS MCFARLAND

Office for which you are running: Highway Agent

Why you see yourself as a qualified candidate:

I have lived in Auburn for 59 years have been in the construction business for 40 years. Besides having the ability to do the job well, I have the necessary equipment to perform the job and the willingness to hire local contractors to help with summer and winter maintenance. Auburn has some of the best roads in the area and I will keep them in excellent shape using the latest materials and techniques. Additionally, Auburn has some of the best equipment operators in the area and they will be able to help me significantly.

My equipment is DOT certified and ready to work for the tax payers of Auburn.

Any changes or improvements you would like to see within the realm of this office:

I absolutely will follow the voters intentions and comply with the purchasing policy adopted in 2014. All major work will be put out to bid to make certain the maximum amount of road work will be completed each season with the allotted budget. It is the right way to spend the tax payers dollars.

Each fall I will make certain plow contractors have calibrated salt/sanders to reduce salt use to only what is needed and hopefully prevent salt contamination of wells of private property.

During the last few years only a small number of local people were hired to work in the town. I wish to reverse that and hire as many as possible to keep more people employed. The current budget is sufficient but just needs to be spent more wisely.

For Highway Agent, Three Years

Office for Which You are Running: Highway Agent

Why you see yourself as a qualified candidate:

I have had the honor of being elected to serve as Auburn's Road Agent for the past nine years. During that time we have made significant progress on improving the roads throughout the Town. When I was first elected Road Agent, the Board of Selectmen told me they did not want any band-aid approaches. For the past nine years, that is the approach we have taken and I am pleased to say we are about five years away from being done with all of the major road reconstruction that may be required. The Town will always need to perform maintenance work, drainage improvements and an occasional overlay of pavement to maintain our road network.

The past couple of years have been difficult on a personal level. I certainly know of the various news accounts concerning issues with the old landfill and a recent indictment. When the Town hired an independent investigator to review these issues, he came to a conclusion that exonerated me. Law enforcement came to a different conclusion. What needs to be said is that a grand jury indictment is a process where only one-side of a story is presented. All of the facts are not presented. It is where the old saying: "You can indict a ham sandwich" comes from.

Any changes or improvements you would like to see within the realm of this office:

We continue to hear rumors about putting all road work out to bid. On two separate occasions - one dealing with the Old Candia Road Bridge and the reconstruction of Margate Drive in 2014 - it was proven the "Auburn way" was the most cost-effective means to accomplishing the work required. In the case of the Old Candia Road Bridge, the cost savings was more than \$100,000. Putting everything out to bid would add tens of thousands of dollars in engineering costs without any guarantee of construction cost savings. I would suggest this is a situation where change is not necessary to make the improvements people are looking for and have come to expect.

I believe we have been doing a good job for the residents of Auburn and I would ask for your support to continue as your Road Agent.

Childfind Clinic

The Auburn School District will be conducting a Childfind Clinic on March 28th from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. at the Auburn Village School. The project involves screening your child in speech, motor and learning skills. The professional staff of the Auburn School District will administer the screening. To be eligible your child must live in Auburn, be under six years old, and be accompanied by a parent or guardian. If you suspect that your child has a disability that affects his or her learning please call the school at 483-2769 ext. 3 to make an appointment.

2015 - 2016 Kindergarten & Grade 1 Registration

KINDERGARTEN: All children living in Auburn who will be five years old on or before September 30th, 2015 are eligible to enter kindergarten in the fall of 2015. Registration packets will be available at the main office beginning Monday, March 16th. Completed registration information packets are due in the main office by Friday, April 3rd. There will be a kindergarten parent information meeting on Tuesday, May 5th in the Media Center at 6:30 pm.

NEW FIRST GRADERS TO AVS: All children living in Auburn who will be six years old on or before September 30th, 2015 are eligible to enter first grade in the fall of 2015. Registration packets will be available at the main office beginning Monday, March 16th. Completed registration information packets are due in the main office by Friday, April 3rd. The students will be given a vision and hearing screening as well as a phonemic awareness assessment to help determine reading readiness skills. Screening will be held in May.





News from the Auburn Town Hall


March Program: A WALK BACK IN TIME

The Secrets of Cellar Holes with Adair Mulligan

March 12th at 7:00 PM - 102 Hooksett Road, Auburn, NH

Hidden deep in the woods, alongside a stone wall, an old trail, or highway; you can find the remains of homes dating back to New Hampshire's first settlers. They are all around us if you know where to look. Old lilacs bushes or sugar maples that are still struggling for survival, or a clean break in a stone wall, are clues that there is a historic site close by. These cellar hole foundations can reveal secrets of the people who lived there and how they survived.

Join us with presenter Adair Mulligan to explore the rich stories that can be found in our own back yards. Mulligan; author, historian, and Director of the Hanover Conservancy; has a runaway curiosity about the natural and cultural history of Northern New England. She will give us a glimpse of the enormous social and economic challenges that these people faced with little resources other than their ability to adapt and make the most of what the land had to offer.



This magnificent farmhouse and cow barn owned by John Griffin was built in 1872 and destroyed by fire in 1937. Also known as the Ponderosa Farm, the foundation can be found along Sucker Brook behind the Auburn Village School.





Look for big news about this year's open house in our April Crier article. The event will take place on Sunday, April 12th from 2-5 p.m.


