

All Attention Turns for Budget

As the seasons have changed, the leaves have turned color and are falling, the temperatures are on a downward slide, and Town officials have begun work in earnest on the development of the proposed budget for 2015.


Department heads and elected officials have begun presenting their budget proposals to the Board of Selectmen, and this process will continue through early December.

The Budget Committee has also begun its work to meet with town officials, review department requests and Selectmen recommendations, and ultimately, present budget recommendations to the voters.

All activity is focused towards the Budget Committee presenting a recommended Town budget at a public hearing to likely be held on January 15, 2015, and ultimately at the Deliberative Session of Town Meeting to be held on Saturday, January 31, 2015.

Town Moderator Jim Tillery has recently appointed Dan Carpenter to fill an open position on the Budget Committee. Dan will be succeeding Don Delande, who has been a long-time member of the Budget Committee whose work schedule has changed to not allow his continued participation.


Route 101 Honors the "Screaming Eagles"



On October 18th, the Town of Auburn hosted state officials and veterans for the dedication of a portion of Route 101 through Auburn to be named in honor of the U.S. Army's 101st Airborne Division, the "Screaming Eagles".

Gathering at Bicentennial Park across from the Town Hall, nearly 100 individuals were present for the unveiling of a sign to be placed on Route 101. State Representative Fed Rice (R-Hampton), State Senator Lou D'Alessandro (D-Manchester) and NH Department of Transportation Commissioner Christopher Clement lead the formal program. Also present were State Senators Sharon Caron (R-Londonderry) and Nancy Stiles (R-Hampton).

The real highlight of the event was the large gathering of members and veterans of the 101st Airborne and other military units from World War II, the Korean Conflict and the Vietnam War. Those present were reported to have made more than 500 jumps during active service and included a veteran of the Battle of the Bulge, 92-year-old Dorothea George whose great-grandson is in the 101st Airborne while she is an active member of an organization that has knitted 500 caps for service members going overseas; in addition to about 25 members of the "Vietnam Knights" who rolled in on their motorcycles.



Another Successful E-Waste Collection Event

Hundreds of Auburn residents turned out on October 18th to get rid of televisions, computers, radios, microwave ovens, printers and other electronic items at the Town's annual E-Waste Collection event.

Held again in the front parking lot of the Auburn Village School, the materials collected completely filled one tractor trailer truck, and approximately two-thirds of a second trailer.





Police Department

During the months of August and September the Town experienced a spike in burglaries. This is not unusual from year to year because of the opening of school. Houses aren't occupied all day long during this time of year because the children are back in school, or people are getting their vacation time in at the end of summer. The burglars know this and get very busy in their felonious activities. The result for Auburn was four burglaries in August and seven in September. This was unacceptable, and measures were taken to combat this. For October there are no burglaries due to the measures we took.



Once we identified the problem, the Auburn Neighborhood Watch groups were asked to be extra vigilant, and they delivered. Along with the Neighborhood Watch, a local car dealer loaned us a vehicle to use in an undercover capacity. The vehicle was a non-descript family type vehicle. No one would ever suspect it was being driven by an on duty Police Officer. Finally, Detective Sergeant Chabot worked long hours to follow up on many leads provided by the Neighborhood Watch groups, along with some very valuable forensic evidence.

The result of all these efforts brought about the solving of five burglaries, information to possibly solve another two burglaries, the recovery of some of the stolen property, and a few arrests. It's unfortunate these incidents happen, and very unfortunate we can't solve all of them, but we are grateful for the high number of burglaries that do get solved, and the recovery of some of the property.

To assist the Auburn residents in battling crimes, and other safety related issues, the Auburn Police Department along with the Auburn Fire Department will join forces with the Auburn Neighborhood Watch to conduct a public safety night. This will take place at the Safety Complex on November 13, 2014 from 6:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. The seminar will provide tips and training on many subjects. Some of the areas to be covered are;

- Alcohol and Driving
- Statement Writing
- Home Heating
