

# News from the Auburn Town Hall

## **APD Operational Review and Risk Assessment Completed**

In March, the Board of Selectmen and Police Commissioners agreed to contract with Municipal Resources, Inc. (MRI) of Meredith to conduct an operational review and risk assessment on the Auburn Police Department.

The process has been completed and the Town has received the written report with approximately 100 recommendations for future improvements.


As part of the overall process, the MRI Team reviewed various reports, budgets and policies of the Police Department and the Town. In addition the team met and interviewed community members and officials, as well as police personnel, in order to gain an understanding of the organizational, operational and management systems and approaches currently in place. These were then compared and contrasted against current best practices in law enforcement and public safety.

The MRI Review Team formally presented their report to a joint meeting of the Board of Selectmen and Police Commission held on August 16th at the Town Hall. Due to the varying complexities of all of the recommendations in the report, police personnel are reviewing and prioritizing the recommendations for implementation. This will be worked through the police administration, Police Commissioners, Board of Selectmen and the Budget Committee as may be necessary.

Copies of the MRI Report are available to the public to review at the Town Hall and the Griffin Free Public Library. It is also available to download or read on the Town of Auburn web site ([www.auburnnh.us](http://www.auburnnh.us))

A second operational review and risk assessment is currently underway on the Auburn Fire Department by a different MRI Review Team. It is anticipated that project will be completed and a report issued by November.

## **Mark Your Calendars – E-Waste Collection Day is September 24th**

Auburn's annual Electronic "E-Waste" Collection Day is scheduled for Saturday, September 24th in the front parking lot of the Auburn Village School from 9 AM to 2 PM.

This annual program is set up to accept any appliance, TV, stereo, computer, printer, radio or other electronic device you want to dispose. Anything that can be plugged in is accepted.

**Household Hazardous Waste Collection Anticipated for September 24th**



At the time the September edition of the Auburn Village Crier is upon us, we do not have with certainty the date for the annual Household Hazardous Waste Collection event.

The Town of Auburn teams up with the Towns of Nottingham and Raymond for this annual activity, which is held at the Raymond landfill property. The date of the event is usually the last Saturday in September, but that will not be confirmed until bids from the vendors are reviewed and accepted . . . . . which takes place after this edition of the Crier is published.

Please watch the Town’s web site, postings at the Town Hall and Post Office, and the electronic sign in front of the Town Hall to confirm the date and time for the Household Hazardous Waste Collection event.



## News From The Police Department

Hello Auburn Residents,

Hard to believe it is already September. School is back in session, so we wanted to just put out a few reminders.

First, that Eaton Hill Road becomes a one-way road going from Raymond Rd to Hooksett Rd from the hours of 7:45AM to 9:15AM and 2:00PM to 3:30PM.

Also, please remember that you are in a school zone near the Auburn Village school, as well as remember that while it's still warm out children are riding bikes, walking or waiting for buses, please stay alert.

The police department would like to congratulate Officer Santuccio and Officer Cashman. Both Officers received the Life Saving Bar which will be worn on their uniforms. Officer Santuccio and Officer Cashman were on patrol when they were dispatched to the Myles travel plaza for a subject who had overdosed on drugs. When they arrived the person was not breathing and his skin was blue. Officer Santuccio began supplying air to the person, then Officer Cashman took over. Officer Santuccio was able to clear the air way while Officer Cashman provided oxygen until rescue could arrive. Once on scene rescue took over, and by the time the ambulance began transporting the subject to the hospital he was breathing on his own. Congratulations to Officer Santuccio and Officer Cashman for being awarded the Life Saving Award and a job well done.

Lastly, the Annual Auburn Duck Race Day is coming up on the 17th. This year we are very excited to have some great plans in store for the town. The officers have been hard at work in the last few months making plans to help make the day great for residents. We have a photo booth, ice cream sundaes, and games for kids. We will also have the DWI/distracted driver simulator again; it was very popular last year. Tower Hill Animal Hospital will be present to offer microchipping for your pets. The service generally is \$51.00 at the animal hospital, but will be offering the service at a discounted rate of 35.00. Just bring your pet down, they tell us they will microchip anything with fur. Neighborhood Watch will also be set up for those of you who may not be members and would like to learn more about it. Our very own K9 Athos and his handler Officer Cashman will be doing demonstrations at 11AM and 2PM. We have also invited many area agencies to come and display different emergency vehicles. Town of Derry Command Van, Fish and Game boat, State Police Cruisers, Manchester SWAT vehicles, Dartmouth emergency helicopter, South Eastern Hazmat response vehicles are just some of the vehicles we have arranged to be here. All vehicles will have a representative with them, and it's a great chance for children and adults to get up close and personal with the equipment and as ask questions. Due to the size of our plans we will have all of these things going on in the front parking lot of the Safety Complex on Eaton Hill Rd. So please wander down our way as your walking through the vendors on Hooksett Rd, we will all be there from 10AM to 2PM on September 17th .
