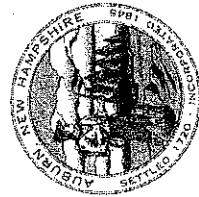

**Twenty-ninth:** Are you in favor of the town modifying the provisions of RSA 72:39-a for elderly exemption from property tax in the Town of Auburn, based on assessed value, for qualified taxpayers, to be as follows: for a person 65 years of age up to 75 years, \$200,000; for a person 75 years of age up to 80 years, \$230,000; for a person 80 years of age or older \$280,000. To qualify, the person must have been a New Hampshire resident for at least 3 consecutive years, own the real estate individually or jointly, or if the real estate is owned by such person's spouse, they must have been married to each other for at least 5 consecutive years. In addition, the taxpayer must have a net income of not more than \$35,000 or, if married, a combined net income of less than \$50,000 and own net assets not in excess of \$50,000 excluding the value of the person's residence.

Should this article be defeated, the default budget shall be \$18,117,489 which is the same as last year, with certain adjustments required by previous action of the Auburn School District or by law; or the governing body may hold one special meeting, in accordance with RSA 40:13, X and XVI, to take up the issue of a revised operating budget only. Estimated tax rate impact is \$.54 (Recommended by the School Board 5-0) (Recommended by the Budget Committee 8-0)
