FY 2021 Budget Near to Completion

The Board of Selectmen completed its work on the FY 2021 Town operating budget and warrant articles which should total approximately \$6 million. As we write this article, the Board's overall spending proposals are coming in ahead of the total budget and

warrant articles approved by the voters in March 2020.

While the general spending amounts are different, we are working with revenue sources that should lead to a near level standard in the Town portion of the tax rate.

The Board's budget effort is only a

part of the Town budgeting process. The Budget Committee is also near to completing their work on the Town and School budgets. They will complete their work by the January 14th, 2021 public hearing on the budgets they will propose to the voters.

Looking Forward to 2021

As we look forward to the coming year and beyond, we want to take the time to acknowledge the hard work and dedicated efforts of our Town and Library work force, elected and appointed officials, as well as Auburn's first responders in fire, law enforcement and EMS service.

Without a doubt, 2020 has been a

very significant year and experience for Auburn's team, in addition to all local, county and state public officials throughout the State and country. This was a year that brought a deadly worldwide pandemic and all that it entails that was not foreseen or anticipated as we arrived at this point in time last year.

Through it all, Auburn residents continued to receive services needed, even if in a different style or format than what we have been used to. No one shirked their duty or responsibility – and it has been very satisfying to have been a small part of this effort.

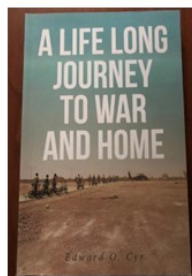

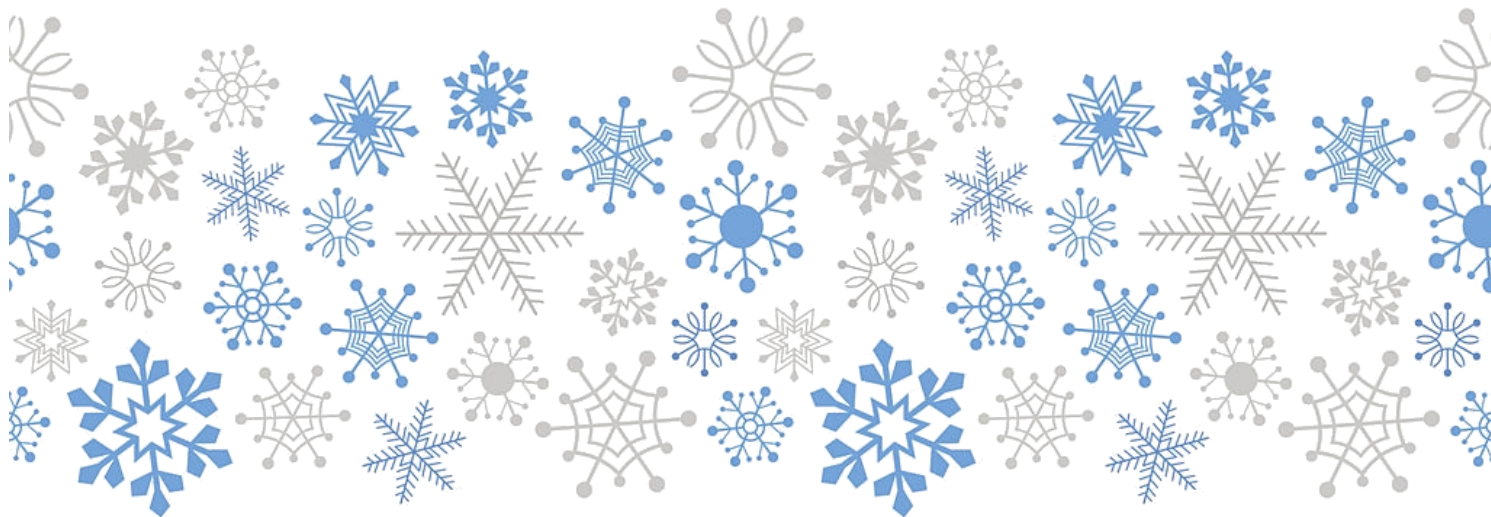

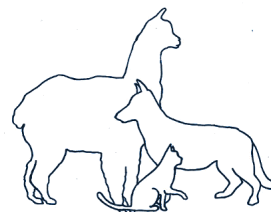

Hello Auburn Residents,

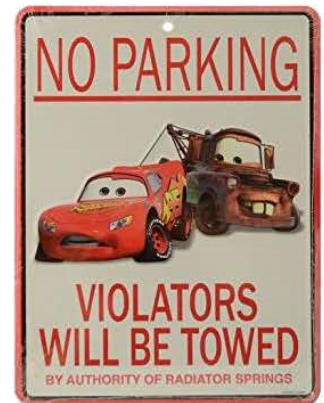
While we realize that these holidays have been unlike any other, we are very proud at how well the community has handled the many challenges that have come with COVID-19. Auburn has been doing a great job, at keeping everyone as safe as possible, and following safety protocols.

With the new year upon us, we've had a few storms so far, but we all know New Hampshire weather will be bringing plenty more in the coming months. We wanted to give you a couple of reminders:



Per New Hampshire State Law it is illegal to put any snow or ice into the roadway. When plowing your driveways please be sure to clear the snow and ice to the sides of your driveway. If you plow across a roadway, please clean up the street when you are done. Snow frozen in the street can become dangerous for plows and other vehicles.

Auburn Town Ordinance Parking Regulations says that from November 15th until April 1st there is no parking permitted on any public street between the hours of midnight and 6AM

Auburn Neighborhood Watch Group - See Something, Say Something

During the month of November, the Auburn Police Department:

- Made 5 Arrests
- Managed 27 Investigations
- Conducted 281 Traffic Stops
- Received 1,229 calls for service.

While these numbers seem high for such a small town, we the community are essential in making sure crimes are reported to the proper authorities. In general, only 50% of those who commit a crime are caught. That's why a strong Neighborhood Watch Program is so important.

The town of Auburn is currently revitalizing the Neighborhood Watch Group (NWG) and we wanted the chance to introduce the NWG Leaders, who act as liaisons to the Auburn Police Department. 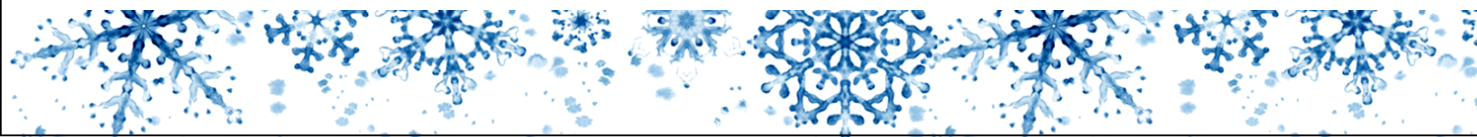

2021 – 2022 Kindergarten & Students New to AVS Entering First Grade

KINDERGARTEN: All children living in Auburn who will be five years old on or before September 30th, 2021 are eligible to enter kindergarten in the fall of 2021. Registration packets will be available at the main office beginning Monday, January 11th. Completed registration information packets are due in the main office by Friday, January 29th. There will be a kindergarten parent information meeting that will be held via Zoom in March. Presently our program is a half day program, however, a full day program is budgeted for implementation in the Fall of 2021. This is only if the school budget is approved by voters.

NEW FIRST GRADERS TO AVS: All children living in Auburn who will be six years old on or before September 30th, 2021 are eligible to enter first grade in the fall of 2021. Registration packets will be available at the main office beginning Monday, January 11th. Completed registration information packets are due in the main office by Friday, January 29th. The students will be given a vision and hearing screening as well as a phonemic awareness assessment to help determine reading readiness skills. Screening will be held in May.

News from the Auburn Historical Association



A Recent History Of the Robie Cemetery

In the Southwest corner of Auburn, a large chunk of property below Wilson's Crossing, with frontage on the Londonderry Turnpike at the Derry line, and connecting up with Steam Mill Rd on the back side was mostly forgotten by 1990. Families had moved away, the buildings were taken down, the fields disappeared, and the woods got deeper.

The area was abandoned except for the occasional deer hunter. It was deer hunters (was it Joe Stacy? George Asadorian? They knew those woods) who discovered the desecration. Vandals had found the little cemetery deep in the woods. Three stones were badly broken - pieces scattered about. Something had to be done.

Don Stitch, a Longmeadow Cemetery Trustee, talked to the Auburn Selectmen, Cemetery Trustees, and pretty much anyone who might be concerned. The Town could protect the stones by moving them to the Longmeadow Cemetery. Otherwise, they would be lost. So, the decision was made and all 6 stones were moved. The 3 badly broken stones were laid in a bed of concrete to restore their integrity.

Sometimes change takes centuries to happen and other times it can happen overnight. Richard Eaton, a developer from Auburn, began buying up the property. He discussed his plan with the Auburn Planning Board who approved and loggers started clearing the woods. Eaton purchased a precast bridge which came on trucks and a crane set it over Cohas Brook in a day. The property was now accessible from Wilson's Crossing Rd. Over a 15 year period, Eaton built over 100 homes and turned the woods into a neighborhood.

Robie Cemetery which once seemed so far in the woods is now on Winters Way, probably 1000 feet from Londonderry Turnpike. The State Of NH was unhappy about the decision to move the stones from Robie Cemetery so the Selectmen had Road Agent Mike Dross move them back. Cemetery Trustee Jim Thompson took responsibility for putting the Robie Cemetery back in order. The concrete slab was cut and Jim used an old photo to make sure the stones were properly aligned.

Take a minute to acknowledge the Robie family who lived and died 150 years ago. The fields they tilled are now mowed weekly. The woods they wandered are now bisected by paved roads with signage SLOW - CHILDREN. It was a different time and a far different era.

AUBURN FIRE DEPARTMENT NEWS



Home fires occur more in winter than in any other season. As you stay cozy and warm this winter, be fire smart!



Half of all home heating fires occur in December, January and February.



1 in every 7 home fires and **1 in every 5** home fire deaths involves heating equipment.



Keep anything that can burn **at least 3 feet** from any heat source like fireplaces, wood stoves, radiators or space heaters.



Keep portable generators **outside, away from windows, and as far away** from your home as possible.



Install and test carbon monoxide alarms **at least once a month**.



Plug only **1 heat-producing appliance** (like a space heater) into an electrical outlet at a time.



Have a qualified professional clean and inspect your chimney and vents **every year**.



Store cooled ashes in a tightly covered metal container, and keep it **outside at least 10 feet** from your home and any nearby buildings.

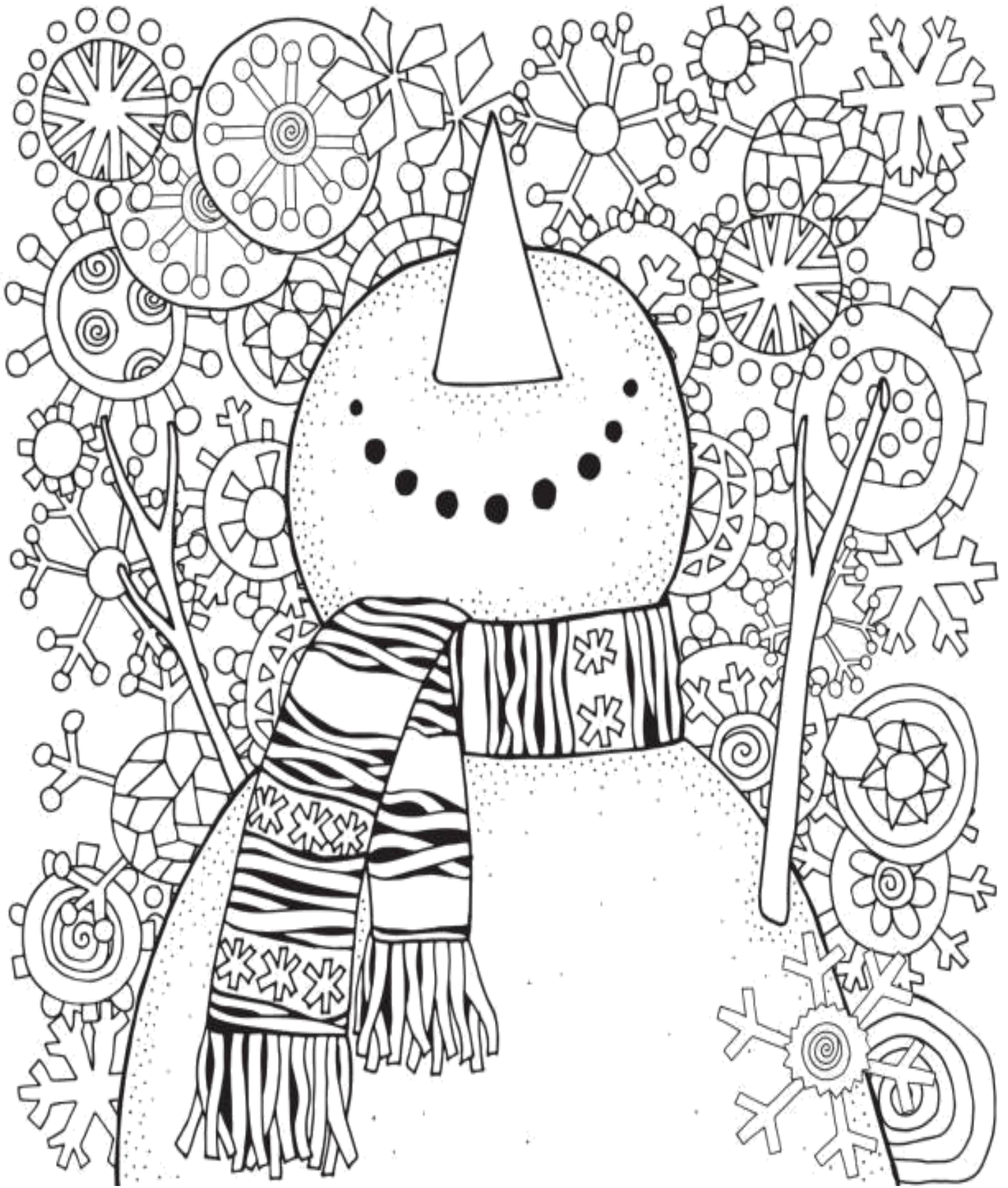
