Board of Selectmen Organization

At the first Board meeting following the March elections, the Board of Selectmen elected Rick Eaton to serve as Selectmen Chairman, while Keith Leclair was elected as Vice Chairman.

The Board also designated its ex-officio committee assignments by selecting Keith Leclair as the Selectmen's representative to the Budget Committee and to the Planning representative to the Parks & Board Rick Faton will

continue to serve as the Selectmen's representative to the Highway Safety Committee, while Todd Bedard will serve as the Selectmen's Recreation Commission.

Town Boards and Committees

As a new year gets underway following the Town Meeting and elections, a number of Auburn residents have been appointed by the Board of Selectmen to positions on various town boards and committees.

Reappointed to the Highway Safety Committee for one year terms were Dan Carpenter and Mike DiPietro, while Margaret Donovan was reappointed to a three year term on the Conservation Commission.

Mark Wright was re-appointed and Dennis Vierria was appointed to three-year terms on the Zoning Board of Adjustment. David Oliviera was re-appointed to a three year term on the Parks & Recreation Commission.

The Selectmen also agreed with the Planning Board's nomination of Paula Marzloff to serve as one of two Auburn representatives to the Southern New Hampshire Planning Commission.

Town Moderator Kathleen Porter has re-appointed Peter Miles and Paula Marzloff to new three-year terms on the Budget Committee.



property. A total of eight vendors submitted proposals for the mowing and maintenance of 11 different Town properties, two cemeteries and the Auburn Village School.




Shred Day will be held on May 11th






