Storage Building Project Nears Completion

As we write this, the three-bay storage building for Town departments is just about complete and should be ready for occupancy by the end of August.

The 20' x 60' structure is generally providing two-bays of storage for Parks & Recreation, and a secured bay for use by the Police Department. This facility will replace the current two self -storage units leased for Parks & Recreation, and one storage trailer that has been used by the Police Department.

Under discussion for several years, the storage facility project came together after voters approved the project during the March 2021 Town voting. The Town put the project out to bid in April and the project was awarded to Pidcor, Inc., of Auburn. While issues related to Covid-19 affected the construction trades in general across the country, the project has overall been able to keep on anticipated timelines.

As we write this, exterior cement pads are being poured, final electrical connections and lights installed, and final interior touches completed. The Town anticipates moving in by the fourth week in August.

Covid-19 impacted the material costs involved with this project. The Town has been able to make use of unanticipated federal funds through the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) to cover these related expenses.

Comings and Goings from Town Boards

During the past few months, the Board has been able to name several Auburn residents to positions on Town boards.

At the recommendation of the Board of Library Trustees, Cynthia Berling was named as an alternate Library Trustee.

With the resignation of Dennis Vieira from the Zoning Board of Adjustment, current ZBA Alternate member Patrick Bergeron was appointed to fill the vacant full-member position on the board.

ZBA Chairman Mark Wright also has resigned his position as of September 1st. The Board has received several applications of residents interested in serving on the ZBA, in addition to having two sitting alternate members who could be appointed to fill the position.

September is When E-Waste Day is Held!!

Please mark your calendars for the annual E-Waste Collection event. The annual "E-Waste Collection" event will be held on Saturday, September 25th from 9 am to 2 pm in the front parking lot of the Auburn Safety Complex on Eaton Hill Road. Without a charge, Auburn residents may dispose of "anything with a plug" from computers and monitors to TVs, radios, stereos and more.



Auburn Receives Federal Funds

Since the June – July edition of the *Auburn Village Crier*, the Town of Auburn has received the first half of its funds from the federal American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) that is intended to assist the Town and its taxpayers over the next several years.

Since last month's report, a final determination has been made that Auburn will receive a total of \$585,123 over two years for use locally. In August, the Town received \$292,188.80 with an identical payment anticipated in July or August 2022.

The Selectmen are working with all Town departments to look at anticipated capital expenses identified in the Town's Capital Improvement Program, projects that have unsuccessful grant applications and other one-time project costs for which the funds may be used. At this point, the Town has obligated some of these funds for a turnout gear extractor and dryer for the Fire Department; replacement of toilet and lavatory units for the holding cell area at the Police Department; completion of the storage building for Parks & Recreation and Police Department; replacement of analog telephone systems at the Fire, Police and Town Hall; repairs to the Eddows Field Clubhouse; ceiling insulation in the area of the Police Department, and an air compressor and tool attachment at the Highway Department.

The Town will have upwards of four years (through December 2024) to spend or obligate the money, and will have through December 31, 2025, to spend all the funds. Any funds not spent will have to be returned to the federal government.

NH Rec Esports League- Fall Session

Season Starts Week of October 4

Esports is one of the fastest growing competitions in the world. This league is a safe way for players to compete with friends on your own in the comfort and safety of your own home.

We are offering the following games in our fall competitions: Rocket League $(3 \vee 3 \text{ and/or } 1 \vee 1, \text{ any device})$ Madden21 (1 v 1, Playstation or Xbox) Super Smash Bros. (1 v 1, Nintendo Switch) Fortnite (1 v 1 and/or 2 v 2, any device)



All games will be divided into 3 age divisions: youth (8-12), teen (13-18) and adult (18+)

Leagues will be run through GGLeagues online gaming and will consist of a six-week season where players will play one game a week. At the end of the season, players will participate in a single elimination tournament to crown the champion. All games will be played within the NH Rec Esports League. All players will be registered through their own town recreation department. The link to the Auburn registration page through GGLeagues is www.ggleagues.com/organization/town-of-auburn. The season starts the week of October 4 with the deadline to register is September 22nd. The cost is \$30 per person per league (players can play in multiple leagues).

To play, you must have a console/computer to play on, email address, own the game you are registering to play and have the ability to play live. All games are monitored by GGLeagues and players are held to a code of conduct to maintain a fun and safe gaming atmosphere.

<u>Tai Chi</u> Thursdays, September 2- 30

Tai Chi is a mind-body exercise from China. It has its roots in martial arts, philosophy, and Traditional Chinese Medicine. The Tai Chi forms are slow, gentle choreographed movements that gracefully flow from one to the next like a dance. More and more seniors are doing Tai Chi to improve their health and reduce their risk of falling.

The 5-week session, with new instructor Greta, will start on Thursday, September 2nd at 11:00 am at the beautiful new location, Bicentennial Park, across from the Town Hall. 



The extent of the population of jumping worms is unknown in NH. Please read more about these on the UNH cooperative extension website. We will also have info about this at our booth, and how to reduce risks to assure that we are not promoting the spread of anything unwanted through our gardens and forests.

We will be doing a seed exchange this fall - please save those seed to swap with your fellow members! **Thank you** to those who have volunteered to staff the booth – we will send out an email reminder of your shifts.

AVS SCHOOLYARD NEWS

We are excited to begin another school year! The first day of school is September 1, 2021. The school day begins for middle school students at 7:50am with student arrival beginning at 7:40. The school day begins for elementary students at 8:50 with student arrival beginning at 8:40. Pick up for middle • school begins at 2:25 for middle school and 3:30 for elementary school. Kindergarten and first grade parent pick up begins at 3:20. Homeroom and advisory placements have been sent home to parents. If you have not received an email notification, please call the school office. Supply lists for each grade level are located on our website. If your child needs any school supplies or a backpack, please notify us. Thank you to Long Meadow Church for providing us additional school backpacks and supplies for those who are in need.

The school board approved our Reopening of School plan that can be located on our website. As always, with further guidance from NH DHHS, changes may be made based on current circumstances. Some important information in regards to the most recent AVS Reopening Pan:

- Masks will be optional for staff and students inside the building
- All students are required to wear masks on buses per CDC Order
- Students will be six feet apart while eating lunch
- All cleaning protocols will remain grades 1-4 and September 23 for in place grade 5-8. More information
- Students will not be required to wear masks while outside
- If the situation worsens, based on community transmission of COVID-19, masks may be required for all occupants of the school building.
- If a student is asked to quarantine, a remote learning option will be provided.

Bus routes have also been posted to our website under the transportation menu. We will continue to utilize PickUp Patrol as our attendance and dismissal system to keep track of any transportation changes. If you are new to PickUp Patrol, you can expect to see an email in the next couple of weeks. It is important that all parents enter a "default plan" in PickUp Patrol before the start of the year. Once bus routes are posted, we ask that vou enter vour child's bus number into the system as their default plan if they are taking the bus. For assistance with PickUp Patrol, please


