


Longmeadow Church Breakfast

Young Auburn Artists Recognized

At the April School Board meeting, three Auburn Village School students were recognized by Town and school district officials for their artistic talents and colorful submissions for consideration to be the cover of the 2017 Town Report.

Ultimately, Ben Wilson's impressive painting of an evening sunset over Lake Massabesic was chosen for the cover of the Town Report. Ben's painting marked the first time a full-color cover had been printed for the annual report.

Since 2012, the Town has paired with the Auburn Village School in soliciting artwork from student artists to be featured on the cover and within the annual report of the Town and School District. A number of very impressive paintings and drawings were submitted this year and judged by Police Chief Ed Picard, Town Clerk Kathleen Sylvia and Library Director Kathryn Growney.

In addition to Ben Wilson, the other top AVS artists recognized by the Town officials and School Board were Molly Kuehl New AFD Rescue Vehicle and Two Replacement Cruisers Ordered


Following the approval of the voters in March, the Board of Selectmen approved the ordering of a new medium rescue vehicle for the Auburn Fire Department. The approval of the order from the Rosenbauer Companies begins an approximate 18month process of building the new vehicle to the specifications requested by the Auburn department.

While a Kenworth cab and chassis is acquired by the manufacturer, final details on the vehicle specifications will be agreed to before construction of the vehicle gets under way. Expectations are the completed vehicle will be delivered to Auburn in mid-2019.

The Board of Selectmen has also approved the lease / purchase of two new replacement police cruisers that were also included in the FY 2018 budget. The Ford Explorer vehicles are acquired off the State of New Hampshire bid list and will replace two older vehicles currently in service.


Cub Scout Pack 127 On a Roll this Spring

race car. The cars, no more than seven inches long and weighing no more than five ounces are all built by the Scouts, and powered by gravity down a long ramp.


There was no shortage of imagination in design when it came to this year's themes of scouting, safari, and hot rods. Congratulations to all the participants and winners!



<u>Attention Home Owners Homes with Fire</u> <u>Sprinklers Systems</u>

A recent study by the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) showed that residential fires have claimed over 3000 lives in the US.

Residential fire deaths decreased in homes with well-maintained Residential Fire Sprinkler Systems, Smoke detectors and Carbon Monoxide Detectors.

"Can the fire sprinklers in your home be counted on in the event of a fire?"

The responsibility for maintaining the residential fire sprinkler system falls upon the unit owner. The best way to know for sure is through regular inspection, testing, and maintenance.

A resent event found that some home owners have failed to maintain the fire sprinkler system or were unaware of the maintenance required. Problems that may occur are low tank water, a failed fire pump, a disabled electric circuit, and painted sprinkler heads, but mainly failed fire protection maintenance.

Here's a quick view of maintenance that should be performed:

An inspection involves completing a visual check of the system to verify that the fire sprinkler system is free of physical damage.

Testing involves determining the operational status of the valves and other system components by conducting periodic physical checks, such as water flow tests and alarm tests.

The system maintenance is the work performed to keep the system operational and to make needed repairs.

Note: With one and two-family dwellings and townhomes with a NFPA13D sprinkler system, a licensed contractor is usually not required <u>unless</u> the system contains anti-freeze. (See your homeowner instructions on inspecting, testing and maintenance of the fire sprinkler system.)
