

# Auburn Revaluation Shows Double-Digit Growth

Property values in Auburn increased in value by an average of 20 percent over the last five years according to the preliminary assessment update being conducted for the town.

In early July, property owners received their preliminary revised assessments. Many property owners met with the assessors in mid-July to learn about how their property was assessed, to review information and discuss any concerns they may have regarding their revised assessment.

We want to stress that it is important to remember the purpose of a revaluation or statistical update is not to raise property taxes. The purpose is to assess all properties fairly and equitably throughout the municipality.

New Hampshire's constitution requires municipalities to "value anew" assessments at least every five years. The last town wide statistical update in Auburn occurred in 2013. State law also requires the assessed values to reflect market values as of April 1, 2018.

Auburn hired Avitar Associates of New England to determine the updated value of Auburn's roughly 2,500 properties.

Unlike other portions of New Hampshire, the real estate market in Auburn has continued to change and grow over the last five years. The values have steadily increased since 2013, and this is all substantiated with recent sales that have occurred during that time frame.

The total value of all taxable properties in town is a key factor in setting the tax rate, which the NH Department of Revenue Administration does for every municipality each fall. The assessed value of a home, when measured against the tax rate, determines how much a particular property owner must pay each year.

Property owners should not measure their new assessment against the current tax rate. Although the tax rate will not be set until the fall, an increase in property valuation is often offset by a corresponding reduction in the tax rate.

Valuations will impact the rate, but not necessarily what people receive for an actual tax bill. As assessed value increase, the tax rate should come down, assuming spending and other revenues remain constant.

It is anticipated that the revised assessments will be completed and presented to the Board of Selectmen in late August.

# Town Hall Renovation and Painting

Read for info. on what to do during construction if you need to visit the town hall. By the time you are reading this, renovation work should have commenced on the front entrance to the Town Hall. Following a competitive bid process, the Town contracted with Target New England, Historical Restorations of Alton Bay for the work that is anticipated to take up to six weeks to complete.

The construction work involves replacing the front stairs and establishing a roof overhead that covers the entirety of the stairs during inclement weather. The work has been designed to maintain the current look and style of the building.

Part of the construction work was the painting of the front side of the building. The Board requested an additional quote to paint the remaining three sides of the building, which was last done in 2008.

During the duration of the work, the front entrance to the Town Hall will not be available to the public. Access to the building will be through a door at the rear of the building. Signs will direct people to this

entrance during the

construction.

The renovation work was awarded at a cost of \$32,460, while the painting of the building will be an

additional \$18, 760. Funds for the work were available in the Town Building

Rehabilitation Capital

Reserve Fund.



Hello everyone, we hope you are all having a spectacular summer! The AVS students and teachers buttoned up a successful school year in June and since then, the construction team has been onsite and is working hard to prepare the school buildings and grounds for the next school year. Fencing and mobilization occurred the week after the end of school and site work began to move two portables. Moving the portables is no small undertaking – new water, plumbing, sewer, data, walkways, roof coverings and such are needed to make the new configuration work for the next year. Once they're moved, a large paved area will be created for the new outside basketball court – a must for winter recess. The front roofs are all slated to be replaced before the beginning of school as well as newly renovated locker room space.

Our Building Committee, comprised of SAU and school administrators, architects, construction managers, and two School Board members, has been meeting regularly and the architects will complete construction documents by mid-July. With those documents, the full bidding process will begin and construction of the new classroom wing will get underway in late September. We expect to construct our access road for construction purposes around the cemetery from the Safety Complex after DES permitting has been approved.

The bond approved by town voters in March was purchased from the New Hampshire Bond bank at a rate just under 3%, the rate the School Board projected prior to the vote. The money was received in June and has been invested. In September, the School Improvement Committee, comprised of Auburn residents and school personnel, will reconvene and take on the task of communicating our progress to everyone going forward. Please stay tuned for more information. Also, please refer to the minutes from the Building Committee and School Improvement Committee available on the AVS website.

Note that most people have received their new assessment from the Town which has nothing to do with the school renovation plans. Contact the Town Hall if you have questions on what the new assessment means to your household.





Some Fun Summer Recipe's To Try...

#### Middle Eastern Vegetable Salad (Barefoot Contessa – "How Easy Is That?" cookbook)

- 10 Scallions (white and green parts, thinly sliced)
  1 pound ripe tomatoes, seeded, cored and ½" diced or 1 pint cherry tomatoes
  1 hothouse cucumber, seeded and ½" diced
  1 can (12 or 16 oz) chickpeas, rinsed and drained
  1/3 cup chopped fresh parsley
  1/3 cup chopped fresh mint leaves
  1/3 cup julienned fresh basil leaves
  1/2 cup freshly squeezed lemon juice (3 or 4 lemons)
  1 tablespoon (3 cloves) minced garlic
  Kosher salt and fresh ground pepper
  1/2 cup olive oil
- 8 oz feta cheese, ½" diced Toasted pita bread

Place the scallions, tomatoes, cucumber, chickpeas, parsley, mint and basil in a large salad bowl and toss to combine.

In a small bowl, whisk together the lemon juice, garlic, 2 teaspoons salt and 1 teaspoon pepper. Slowly whisk in the olive oil to make an emulsion. Pour the dressing over the salad, tossing gently to coat all the vegetables. Add the feta, sprinkle with salt and pepper and toss gently. Serve the salad with the toasted pita bread.

#### **Toasted Pita Bread**

l package pita bread Olive oil Kosher Salt & freshly ground pepper

Preheat oven to 375. Cut each pita bread in quarters and each quarter in half to make 8 triangles. Place them in a single layer on a sheet pan; sprinkle lightly with olive oil, salt and pepper. Bake for 10 minutes, until crisp.



We used store-bought rotisserie chicken to add protein then combined finely chopped lettuce with all of our favorite southwest-inspired ingredients.

We easily achieved the simple Tex-Mex flavor by combining pre-made taco seasoning and ranch dressing. Amp up the heat with diced jalapeños, green chiles or red pepper flakes then add cilantro and lime for brightness and crushed tortilla chips for texture.

Toasted pumpkin seeds, avocado, cubed cheese and beans really gussy up the finished product. Serve this chicken salad recipe for any occasion, and if you have
