Pursuant to RSA 31:95-b and Article 14 of the 2000 Town Meeting, the Auburn Board of Selectmen will hold a public hearing on Monday, June 6, 2016 beginning at 7:00 P.M. at the Auburn Town Hall for the purpose of receiving public comment concerning the acceptance and expenditure of the following unanticipated revenues:

 Receipt of \$49,799.12 from the unanticipated sale of three properties taken by Tax Collector Deeds in 2015, and to authorize the expenditure of \$14,000 from these funds towards the operational review and risk analysis of the Town of Auburn fire and rescue operations.

Immediately following the public hearing on the acceptance and expenditure of unanticipated revenues, the Auburn Board of Selectmen will continue a public hearing begun on May 16, 2016 on the adoption of a proposed "Prohibition and Regulation of Fireworks Ordinance" for the Town of Auburn pursuant to the provisions of NH RSA 160-C:6.

Board of Selectmen Town of Auburn May 17, 2016

NH RSA 160-C:1 PERMISSIBLE FIREWORKS

II. "Consumer fireworks" means consumer fireworks as defined in 27 C.F.R. section 555.11 and formerly known as class C common fireworks.

Consumer fireworks.

Any small firework device designed to produce visible effects by combustion and which must comply with the construction, chemical composition, and labeling regulations of the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission, as set forth in title 16, Code of Federal Regulations, parts 1500 and 1507. Some small devices designed to produce audible effects are included, such as whistling devices, ground devices containing 50 mg or less of explosive materials, and aerial devices containing 130 mg or less of explosive materials. Consumer fireworks are classified as fireworks UN0336, and UN0337 by the U.S. Department of Transportation at 49 CFR 172.101. This term does not include fused setpieces containing components which together exceed 50 mg of salute powder

160-C:6 Local Option. – Any municipality in the state, by action of its local legislative body or local governing body, may vote to allow or to prohibit, within that municipality, the issuance of permits or licenses to sell permissible fireworks or the display or possession of permissible fireworks.

160-C:1 Definitions. – In this chapter: V. "Permissible fireworks" means consumer fireworks, except for those items that are prohibited pursuant to RSA 160-B:16, 160-B:16-b, and 160-B:16-c.

160-B:16 Certain Sparklers Prohibited; Penalties. -

- I. Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the sale, possession or display of class "C" sparklers or those sparklers consisting of a wire or stick which contain chlorates or perchlorates is prohibited.
- III. Any person who displays or possesses without intent to sell class "C" sparklers or sparklers consisting of a wire or stick which contain chlorates or perchlorates shall be guilty of a violation.

(Sparklers that contain < 3.5 oz of pyrotechnic material per stick are considered novelty fireworks and are permissible)

- **160-B:16-b Retail Sale of Firecrackers Prohibited; Penalty.** The retail sale of firecrackers is prohibited. In this section, "firecracker" means a ground device firecracker as defined by the American Pyrotechnics Association in APA Standard 87-1 (2001) 3.1.3.1, as amended. Any person who violates the provisions of this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.
- **160-B:16-c** Retail Sale of Bottle Rockets Prohibited; Penalty. The retail sale of bottle rockets is prohibited. In this section, "bottle rocket" means a bottle rocket as defined by the American Pyrotechnics Association in APA Standard 87-1 (2001) 3.1.2.1, as amended. Any person who violates the provisions of this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

Re: Proposed Special Events / Fire Watch Ordinance and Fireworks Regulations

Ordinance

As early as January this year, work began on drafting a proposed "Special Events and Fire Watch Ordinance" after a special effort was made to enable the Auburn Tavern to have live entertainment on New Year's Eve and remain in compliance with NFPA and appropriate life safety standards. Aware that this could become more than a one-time event at only one facility, Fire Captain James Salunier and Building Inspector/Code Enforcement Officer Carrie Rouleau-Cote recommended a general ordinance in this area would be an appropriate course of action for the Town.

In addition, former Fire Chief Bruce Phillips had also developed a proposed ordinance that dealt with the regulation of fireworks in the Town of Auburn to ensure the Town would be in compliance with state statute.

Both proposed regulations have been completed, and have been reviewed and approved in their current version by Town Counsel Jennifer St. Hilaire. Fire Chief Ed Gannon would like to advance the ordinances for the Board's consideration for adoption.

A public hearing to formally consider both ordinances has been scheduled for Monday, May 16th. But we wanted to initially provide the draft ordinances to the Board at your meeting on May 2nd so you will have time to review the material. Chief Gannon will be present at both meetings to answers questions and address concerns.

There is no action required of the Board at your meeting on May 2nd. Following the public hearing on May 16th, the Board can choose to adopt the proposed ordinances as presented; they could amend and adopt the proposed ordinances, or they may chose not to adopt the proposed ordinances.

Section 1: PURPOSE

In accordance with the provisions of NH RSA 160-C:6, it shall be illegal for any person, firm, partnership or corporation to offer for sale, expose for sale, sell at retail, purchase, posses, use, explode or display any permissible fireworks within the Town of Auburn, except as specifically provided for in this ordinance.

Section 2: AUTHORITY

The authority for the Auburn Board of Selectmen to regulate the sale, purchasing, handling or exploding of fireworks is contained in RSA 160-C: 6.

Section 3: **DEFINITIONS**

In This Ordinance:

- "Display" means the use, explosion, activation, ignition, discharge, firing or any other activity which is intended to cause or which causes a firework to do what it was manufactured to do.
- 2. "Permissible Fireworks" means those consumer firework devices defined as "permissible fireworks" in NH RSA 160-C:1, as the same currently exists or as, from time to time, hereinafter amended.
- 3. "Fire Chief" means the Fire Chief of the Town of Auburn or his/her designee.
- 4. "Police Chief" means the Police Chief of the Town of Auburn or his/her designee.

Section 4: **PERMISSIBLE FIREWORKS**

Subject to, and in accordance with the provisions of RSA 160-C, it shall be lawful to possess and/or display permissible fireworks upon compliance with the following requirements:

- A person who is 21 years of age or older may display permissible fireworks on private property with the written consent of the owner or in the owner's presence, subject to the provisions of this ordinance and NH RSA 160-C, and any other applicable ordinance or statute.
- 2. No display of permissible fireworks shall be permitted within the Town of Auburn except between the hours of 6 PM and 11PM on Fridays and Saturdays in the months of June and July and between the hours of 6PM and 10PM on Fridays and Saturdays between the months of August through May. Permissible fireworks shall be permitted on the following

holidays; Labor Day, The Fourth of July (including the evening of July 3rd, beginning at 6PM until 11PM), and New Year's Eve beginning at 6PM until 1AM on January 1st.

- 3. The display of permissible fireworks shall be of such a character, and so located and conducted, that it shall not be hazardous to property or endanger any person. In accordance with the provisions of NH RSA 160-C, no permissible fireworks shall be permitted on public property and must be 50 feet from nearby buildings and structures, nearby trees, electrical and telephone lines or other overhead obstructions, and any location of any nearby storage of flammable or combustible liquids or gases.
- 4. No permissible fireworks may be used, discharged, exploded, or displayed during periods of high or extreme fire danger as determined by the Fire Chief or the New Hampshire Division of Forests and Lands.
- 5. Permissible fireworks may be used, discharged, exploded, or displayed in a manner such that any and all discharge debris shall remain within the property lines of the lot on which the display originates.
- 6. Anyone using permissible fireworks shall be responsible for removing any debris accumulated due to the discharge of fireworks that fall onto the public way, public property and any private property within twenty-four hours of discharge. Anyone failing to remove such debris shall be financially responsible for its cleanup.
- 7. If a fire is caused from the discharge of any fireworks display, the responsible party/parties involved may be subject to reimbursing the Town of Auburn for all suppression costs.

Section 5: **PERMIT REQUIRED**

Any person, group or organization wishing to display, discharge, explode any fireworks other than "Consumer Fireworks", shall be required to apply for a permit to display fireworks and shall include a copy of a certificate of competency as provide in **NH RSA 158:9-f**. Any person wishing to display fireworks other than "Consumer Fireworks" shall meet the provisions of **NH RSA 160-B:7** and by the provisions of **NH Code of Administrative Rules**, **saf-C2600**.

Permits will be issued by the Fire Chief and or his/her designee after an inspection has been conducted and the application has been approved. **NH RSA 160-B:7**.

Section 7: **ENFORCEMENT**

- A. The Fire Chief or the Police Chief may suspend the use of the permissible fireworks for any of the following reasons:
 - Unfavorable weather conditions, including but limited to, lightning storms or high wind conditions.
 - If any person under the age of 21 possesses, uses, discharges or explodes, used, discharged or exploded any permissible firework device and is a chargeable offense in accordance with NH RSA 160-C:11.
 - 3. If any person who is using, discharging, exploding, or displaying the permissible fireworks appears to be under the influence of alcohol or drugs.
 - 4. If in the opinion of the Fire Chief or Police chief, the use, discharge, exploding, or display of permissible fireworks would create a threat to public safety.
- B. The Fire Chief and/or Police Chief are authorized to seize, take, remove or cause to be removed, at the expense of the owner, all firework devices that are being discharged in violation of this ordinance.

Section 8: **PENALTIES**

Any organization, office or individual(s) who willfully violates this Ordinance shall be guilty of a violation, punishable by a fine not exceeding Five Hundred (\$500.00) dollars per day for the first offense; Seven Hundred and Fifty (\$750.00) dollars per day for the second offense, and One Thousand (\$1,000.00) dollars per day for the third or greater offense. Violators may be assessed additional fines for each day the violation continues.

Section 9: NON-COMPETE OR RELIQUISHMENT OF OTHER REQUIREMENTS

Nothing in the Town of Auburn Special Events and Fire Watch Ordinance shall be interpreted so as to conflict with the provisions of Chapters 160-B and 160-C of the New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated, as currently written, or as from time to time hereafter amended.

Section 10: **SEVERABILITY**

If any provision of this Ordinance is declared invalid or unconstitutional, it shall not be held to invalidate, or impair the validity, force or effect of any other provision of this Ordinance, and all provisions not declared invalid or unconstitutional will continue in effect.

Section 11: SUPERCESSION

Re: Grant Program for Potential Bike Path Project

The NH Department of Transportation (NHDOT) has announced the application period for the next round of funding for the Transportation Alternative Program (TAP) to take place this year. This is the funding program for improving pedestrian and bicycling infrastructure with more than \$5 million in federal funds being made available for New Hampshire programs.

The TAP program combines several previous individual federal programs into one single program. The former programs included the Transportation Enhancement, Safe Routes to School and Scenic Byways programs.

Prior Boards of Selectmen have looked at this potential for either sidewalks or bike paths. In 2006, a Transportation Enhancement grant had been unsuccessfully applied for. In 2013, an initial study effort for the Safe Routes to School program was undertaken under the direction of the School Board, which led to general support for a bike path connecting the area of Auburn Village School to Shore Drive. In late 2013 / early 2014, the Board of Selectmen included the use of property owned by Manchester Water Works (MWW) from the center of Town to Shore Drive and the support of MWW for a bike path in this location as one of the provisions in the PILOT agreement between the City and the Town. In mid-2014, the Board of Selectmen did not feel they were ready to advance such a project to the voters for the Town's share of funding, and deferred consideration of the project until the next available round of grant funding.

Which brings us to NHDOT's most recent announcement of the next round of grant funding. Should the Board want to advance a project, we need to prepare and submit a Letter of Intent to apply by July 1st. There will then be a mandatory pre-application workshop to attend likely in August. And then the submission of a formal TAP application, for which we do not know a deadline, but I would assume it will be in the fall.

Attached for your benefit is a map of the proposed route that was prepared by Stantec in 2014, in addition to the \$497,000 cost estimate prepared at that time. Under the TAP program, 80% of that amount (\$397,600) would come from grant funds while 20% (\$99,400) would be the Town's portion of the project costs.

We are seeking the Board's direction for whether they would like to submit a grant application for this effort in 2016. If you are, we should request Stantec review and update, if necessary, the estimated project costs and prepare the material required for the initial Letter of Intent to be filed by July 1st.

Applying for the grant does not obligate the Town to accept the grant, although I would not encourage the Board to apply unless it believes it wants to move in this direction and that you are prepared to budget for the Town's share if successful in March 2017.

Re: Former Fire Station Building - Raymond Road

Since the Board's May 16th discussion concerning the former fire & police station building on Raymond Road, we have the following update for the Board.

- 1) Based on the discussion about building a possible storage building on this site, we have reached out to Morton Buildings and have requested rough cost estimates for a potential barn-style storage building that would include a small workshop area. I had heard mention of both a 30' x 60' and a 50' x 60' building, so have asked for potential costs of both. We do not yet have estimates for the Board.
- 2) On May 17th, Gerald Demirjian was in contact with us and reiterated his interest in the property and indicated his proposal adopted by voters at the 2011 Town Meeting was still on the table. In simple terms, that proposal provided a minimum purchase price of \$60,000; guaranteed improvements to the building, driveway and parking area; continued workshop space for Parks & Recreation and outdoor storage for picnic tables; and the first right to re-acquire the property if the new owner is no longer interested in owning the property. An option for the Board to consider would be using some of the sales proceeds to invest in picnic tables that can remain in place year round, and would not require the type of winter storage and maintenance the Town now experiences.
- 3) Finally, as part of the current Capital Improvement Plan process, the Police Department has submitted a proposal to expand the garage capacity for the department at the Safety Complex to include both additional bays and additional second-floor storage space. When first looked at in 2011 with assistance from Stantec Consulting, a stand-alone garage was roughed out. Two options were looked at a 48' x 48' foot garage (which accommodated three cars wide, two cars deep), and a 48' x 28' garage (accommodates three cars wide, one car deep). Costs estimates developed at that time were \$199,298 for the larger space and \$148,241 for the smaller unit.

Whatever space may actually be developed would be able to handle some of what the department currently stores in the former fire station building.
