## Additional Highway Funding Assists Auburn Projects

The Town of Auburn has received a onetime additional amount of funding in local highway aid from the State of New Hampshire this year. The Legislature required the funds to be used for projects that were not already locally budgeted.

Following a workshop meeting and then a public hearing, the Board of Selectmen has allocated the \$137,228 in funds to four different to projects that will be undertaken in 2017 and 2018.

The largest project is the establishment of a 32' x 48' salt storage facility to be erected at the highway department property on Chester Turnpike. The salt storage facility, which will cost \$74,975, will enable the Town to stockpile a significant amount of salt for use in the Town's winter road operations.

Currently, the Town has storage capacity in a lean-to style shed to cover one or two large winter storms. As the winter season progresses, it becomes more difficult to receive regular delivery of salt as needed.

With the new storage capacity, the Town will be able to stockpile a much larger supply of salt early in the season which will enable the Town to not have to seek re-orders of salt on a near weekly basis when it is critically needed.

A second project is the establishment of a

temporary driveway for access to properties affected by the closure of the Griffin Mill Bridge. Due to the deteriorating condition of the Griffin Mill Bridge, the Town had to close the bridge earlier this year. Until the bridge is reconstructed, a temporary driveway access off Manchester Road (Route 121) will be provided to these properties. The estimated cost to establish the temporary driveway is \$15,000.

A third project is the development of plans for a proposed multi-use path that would run along Route 121 from Eaton Hill Road to Shore Drive. The Town had submitted an application earlier this year for funding through a competitive state grant program which narrowly missed being funded. By having the engineered plan in place and the project, in essence, shovel ready to move forward, the Town will be in a more competitive position in submitting a grant application in 2019. The cost of developing the plans is \$30,000.

And a fourth project to be partially funded is the improvement to the drainage system on Dartmouth Drive. During the past year, several sinkholes developed in various parts of the road necessitating the closure of the upper portion of the road for the summer months. It has been determined a series of underdrains and other improvements are required to resolve the base problem with the road. The \$17,228.26 remaining in the one-time State funds has been allocated to this work.

## Auburn Invited to Apply for Park Grant Funds

The Town of Auburn has been invited by the NH Division of Parks and Recreation to apply for funding through the Land and Water Conservation Fund (LWCF) Program. If successful, the funding would cover half of the cost to complete the parking lot expansion, installation of parking lot lights, and development of a walking path between the parking lot and established fields at the Eddows Recreational Fields on Priscilla Lane.

The LWCF Program was part of the funding for the original establishment of ball fields on the Pricilla Road property which was then known as Sandy Acres.

Engineering estimates for the cost of completing the parking lot and pathway project are approximately \$75,000. LWCF Pro-

gram awards are a minimum of \$25,000 up to a maximum of \$250,000, and would cover 50% of the project cost. The Town needs to submit its grant application by January 12<sup>th</sup>, 2018, with project awards anticipated to be announced in September / October 2018. If Auburn is approved for funding, it is anticipated the work would take place in 2019.

#### **Adjustment in ZBA Membership**

In the fall Zoning Board of Adjustment member Jeffrey Benson moved from Auburn and vacated his seat on the board. We were pleased to be able to appoint Peggy Neveu from serving as an alternate member to a full member of the ZBA to fulfill the remainder of Mr. Benson's term, which expires in March 2019.

### The School Improvement

Committee continued to meet and listened

to reasons why the vote didn't pass last year. The committee looked closely at the school needs and recommended a modest addition keeping the front facade of the building and meeting many of the School Board goals for Auburn Village School. The committee then looked at all options presented and made a recommendation to the School Board for their review. The School Board met November 14th and discussed the options. The School Board agreed to present a proposal to the town which represents a roughly 40% decrease from last years warrant article. The renovation/addition project will remove all portables and modular classrooms and add a new classroom wing to replace these spaces. In addition, the project will add or renovate existing spaces including nurse, administrative and special services spaces, as well as expand the cafeteria and kitchen space to accommodate more students per lunch period.

The next steps include finalizing the designs and getting schematic pricing so we can have a guaranteed maximum price to share with the community. The School



Improvement Committee will also be looking at bond rates and lengths to determine approximate tax impact. Multiple public input sessions will be held in January, February and March so community members can learn more about the project.

Stay tuned to learn more!

School Improvement Committee will meet on December 13th to continue to discuss the project and ways to communicate to the town. Public is always welcome. As a reminder the School Improvement Committee is comprised of Community members, School Administration, School Board and Town Government.


Dale Chihuly.
