News from the Auburn Town Hall

Adjustment to Building Permit Fee Schedule

In March, voters approved a change to the Town's Zoning Ordinance that authorized the Board of Selectmen to establish and amend as may be necessary a fee schedule for the issuance of building permits. The ordinance until then contained the fee schedule and would require an amendment to the ordinance to adjust the fees.

On April 24th, the Board held a public hearing on a proposed adjustment to the building permit fee schedule as proposed by Building Inspector Carrie Rouleau-Cote.

The new fee schedule, which takes effect on July 1st, includes modest increases for some permits and no changes for other types of permits. A full listing of the fee schedule is available through the Building Inspector's Office and is also available on the Town's web site.

Building permit fees have not been adjusted in more than 15 years.

Parks & Recreation Appointment

BK Bazan of Bunker Hill Road has been appointed to fill the vacancy on the Parks and Recreation Commission left by the recent resignation of Alex Eisman.

Mr. Bazan's term of office is until March 2019 and completes the seven-member commission.

Sink Hole on Dartmouth Drive

For the second time in eight years, a sink hole has developed near the crest of the hill on Dartmouth Drive. The current hole is several hundred feet further uphill than the earlier one.

Road Agent Mike Dross has barricaded the area to block traffic from going beyond the developed properties on Dartmouth Drive as a temporary solution. The Road Agent will be working with the Town's engineers a little later in the construction season to work on the current sink hole in order to perform a permanent repair to the current situation.

Lawn Mowing Contract

For the first time, the Auburn School District and the Town of Auburn jointly sought proposals for lawn mowing and maintenance services for the 2017 season. The proposal process combined the school and town properties for vendor's consideration, but kept them separate in terms of invoices and expenses.

Proposals from five regional contractors were received ranging from a combined low annual cost of \$24,000 to a high of \$42,000.

In separate decisions, the Board of Selectmen chose ASAP Landscapers of Bow for the Town properties at an annual cost of \$24,500, while the School District also selected ASAP at an annual cost of \$2,500. ASAP has handled the Town's work for the past two years, while they will be new to the School District this year.

The contract for 2017 is able to be extended for 2018 and 2019 if both parties chose to do so.

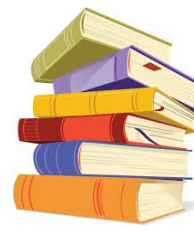

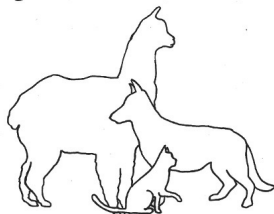

Hello Auburn Residents,

Vince Lombardi once said, "Individual commitment to a group effort—that is what makes a team work, a company work, a society work, a civilization work."

Last summer, Selectman Dale Phillips had the idea that all the trail gates should be labeled with an address for emergency purposes, an idea she was committed too. Someone came to me with her idea and asked me to run with it... I'm not runner, so I drove to all 57 entrances in Auburn and mapped out the GPS coordinates, something I was committed too. I worked with Manchester water works, the town and E-911 dispatch to make her idea a reality. Since we called it the "gates project" and my last name happens to be Gates, I enjoyed the task.

After the addresses were officially accepted by the state, Manchester Water works ordered signs to be made, and this spring installed them with information about the location of each entrance, an effort they were committed too. Most importantly all Manchester Water Works gates in Auburn now all have official street addresses. If you have an emergency and call 911 while near our trails, they will be able to find the closest entrance for emergency personnel to get to you as fast as possible.

I asked Manchester Water Works if we could have an official moment to uncover the signs with Selectman Phillips there, and I asked that one trail be dedicated to her. They agreed, and she will be the only one with this honor. We all came out and let her pull the covering down to reveal her idea as a reality. It was a proud moment for a lot of us, and I'm happy to be a part of it, a symbol to each of our individual commitment to this group effort.

As the nice weather finally starts to show up, we hope you and your family will take the time to get out and enjoy some walking on the trails around town, and feel a bit safer knowing the team efforts of the police department, fire department, selectmen's office, town hall, Manchester Water Works, and E-911 have made the needs of emergency response that much faster in our town.
