News from the Auburn Town Hall



Board of Selectmen Organization

At the first Board meeting following the March elections, the Board of Selectmen reelected Jim Headd to serve as Selectmen Chairman, while Rick Eaton was re-elected as Vice Chairman.

The Board also delegated its ex-officio committee assignments by including Jim Headd as the Selectmen's representative to the Budget Committee and to the Parks & Recreation Commission. Rick Eaton will continue to serve as the Selectmen's representative to the Highway Safety Committee, while Dale Phillips will serve as the Selectmen's representative to the Planning Board.

Town Boards and Committees

As a new year gets underway after Town Meeting and elections, a number of Auburn residents have been appointed by the Board of Selectmen to positions on various town boards and committees.

Reappointed to the Highway Safety Committee for one year terms were Dan Carpenter, Mike DiPietro and Eva Komaridis, while Lisa Canavan and Patrick Kelly were reappointed to three-year terms on the Parks and Recreation Commission.

Michael DiPietro and Kevin Stuart were re-appointed to three-year terms on the Zoning Board of Adjustment (ZBA), while Sharon Bluhm and Jean Worster were reappointed to one-year terms as Library Trustee Alternates.

Jeffrey Porter and Edward Fehrenbach were re-appointed to three year terms on the Conservation Commission.

Patricia Rousseau was confirmed for re-appointment as both Deputy Town Clerk and Deputy Tax Collector, while Linda Dross was confirmed for re-appointment as Deputy Town Treasurer.

Operational Review to Get Underway

With the approval of the FY 2017 operating budget, the Town has initiated a contract for an operational review and risk analysis of the Auburn Town Hall functions intended to highlight what is working well and identify what might be improved. The Board of Selectmen agreed to contract with Municipal Resources, Inc., of Meredith for this effort.

The Board had approved two similar efforts in 2016 for operational reviews and risk analysis of the Auburn Fire Department and the Auburn Police Department. The Police Department review was completed at the end of July, while the Fire Department review was completed in October 2016.

The review of the Town Hall operations is expected to commence in May and would likely be completed by July or August.



The Auburn Fire and Police Departments have been working in conjunction with the school staff creating more efficient evacuation plans. We plan to conduct a drill in the next few weeks. There will be more information as it comes available through the school and our website.

April was Distracted Driver Awareness Month. With grant money awarded to the department from the State of New Hampshire, officers were able to conduct targeted patrols in reference to those violations. 
