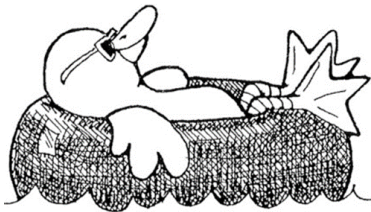

Auburn Receives Additional Road Funds

The Town of Auburn has received an additional \$137,228.26 from the State of New Hampshire as part of the Governor and Legislature's efforts to return nearly \$37 million to municipalities for local highway and bridge aid.

Approved as part of Senate Bill 38, the funds were part of a surplus balance from the State's last fiscal year that ended July 31st.

The additional funds were distributed to the state's 234 municipalities based on a formula that factors in the miles of Class IV and V Town roads and the municipal population in proportion to the total state population.

The additional funds have to be used for municipal highway construction, reconstruction or maintenance purposes, and the Legislature has required the funds cannot be spent on locally budgeted and approved work already in place.

Before the end of the year, the Board of Selectmen will need to make a decision as to what project or projects these one-time funds will be applied towards. It is anticipated the actual work would not take place until next year.

Cemetery Trustee Resigns

Unfortunately after a short time as an appointed member of the Board of Cemetery Trustees, Paul Therrien has found it necessary to resign his appointment.

The Board of Selectmen and Cemetery Trustees will be seeking another individual to serve in this capacity until March 2018, when the balance of Donald Marzloff's original term of office will be filled by Town election.



Special Election on September 26th

Voters in the Towns of Auburn, Chester and Sandown will be holding a special election on September 26th to fill one of the State Representative positions in Rockingham District #4. The position became vacant with the passing of Rep. William Polewarczyk of Chester.

On August 8th, James F. Headd of Auburn won the Republican Primary election to move onto the September election where the ballot will include Democratic candidate Kari Lerner of Chester, Libertarian candidate James D. Jarvis of Sandown and Republican Headd.

Voting in Auburn will be held at the Auburn Village School gymnasium on September 26th from 7 AM to 7 PM.

The individual elected at the Special Election will fill the remaining term of the late Representative Polewarczyk through the end of December 2018.

Household Hazardous Waste Collection – October 7th

The annual Household Hazardous Waste Collection event for Auburn residents has been scheduled for Saturday, October 7th from 9 AM to 1 PM at the Raymond landfill property. The Town of Auburn teams up with the Towns of Nottingham and Raymond for this annual activity.

Passing of Two Pillars of the Auburn Community

We would be remiss if we did not pause to recognize the passing of two pillars of the Town of Auburn. Emerson C. Heald, Sr., passed away on August 1st, while Carl Mayland died on August 7th.

For more than 25 years, "Emmy" Heald served as the Auburn Chief of Police. A U.S. Navy veteran, he dedicated his life to service including being an active member and leader of the Candia Masonic Lodge, the Manchester and Winnepesaukee Bektash Temple, the Royal Order of Jesters and the Lions Club.

Carl Mayland moved to Auburn after retiring from Ford Motor in 1987. He established Viking Oil Company, but was also an active community member with

the Boy Scouts of America, the Auburn Historical Society and the Griffin Free Public Library. He also enjoyed being Santa at every opportunity.

To say they will be missed is to collectively agree the silence that comes with their passing will be deafening.
